Make sure that you mention that you are with the Region 3 Airstream Group, so they will allow you to register this early. Normally, they don't take reservations more than 30 days before your desired camping date. Reserve your site soon so we can group together. We are concentrating on Area 2. As the date gets closer, we will activate online rally registration, as we have done before. Be patient because we can't activate it until we have everything nailed down.

Nuts & Bolts by Terry & Annie Montgomery (BRN 3156)

Before you blow your breaker

Take a minute and see how many amps you could be using in your RV's 30 or 50 AMP electrical system. It is really surprising how fast the AMPS add up and the next thing you know you have tripped a breaker. This could be a breaker in your rig or the park's breaker on the power pedestal. Knowing how many AMPS different electrical appliances in your Airstream use can help you manage your usage and hopefully avoid the inconvenience of losing power. Here is a list of typical appliances in your rig and the AMPS required to operate them.

- air conditioner (15,000 btu) 12.5 amps
- coffee pot 11.0 amps
- computer 4.5 amps
- crock pot 1.5 amps
- electric frying pan 10.0 amps
- electric water heater (6 gallons) 12.5 amps
- food processor 6.0 amps
- hair dryer 10.0 amps
- heater (1100 watts) 10.0 amps
- microwave 12.5 amps
- refrigerator 4.0 amps

In the morning if you use the air conditioner and the water heater, make coffee and watch the television you are definitely going to trip your breaker. This scenario especially holds true if you have a 30 amp system. Even with a 50 amp service you still need to be aware of how many appliances you are trying to use at one time. It is really easy to get carried away. While the list above does contain some of the most commonly used appliances, it is not all inclusive. Most electrical appliances show how many watts or amps it takes to operate them. For reference please refer to the following simple formulae:

watts divided by 120 volts = amps

amps times volts= watts

You can save yourself some grief by operating your water heater on propane and also your refrigerator. Managing your energy usage can help you avoid the anxiety you experience when your power goes out because you BLEW YOUR BREAKER!!!

Hopefully you find this information helpful. This is a much talked about subject among your fellow Airstreamers.

Cole Slaw with Vinegar

- 5 lb. Shredded Cabbage
- 3 Cups Sugar

Pour Sugar over Cabbage and let set awhile, then mix

3 Cups Vegetable Oil
3 Cups Apple Cider Vinegar
8 tsp Sugar
4 tsp Dry Mustard
4 tsp Celery Seed
Salt and Black Pepper



Mix above together and pour over Cabbage mix

Best if refrigerated overnight before serving.

Will keep in refrigerator 2-3 weeks

<u>Recipes</u>

Salted Caramel Butter Bars

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups butter softened
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 1/2 cups powdered sugar
- 1 Tbsp vanilla
- 4 cups flour
- 1 14 oz bag caramels unwrapped
- 1/3 cup whipping cream
- 1/2 tsp vanilla
- 1 Tbsp coarse sea salt

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Line a 9x13 pan with parchment paper or aluminum foil. Lightly spray with cooking spray.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl cream together butter, sugar, and powdered sugar. Add vanilla and beat until combined. Mix in the flour and combine until it forms a soft dough.
- 3. Press half of the dough in the bottom of a 9x13 dish and place the other half of the dough into the refrigerator. Bake in preheated oven for 15 minutes.
- 4. Remove the pan from the oven and melt the caramels, heavy cream and 1/2 tsp vanilla in the microwave for 1 minute. Stir together until smooth. Pour evenly over the hot crust. Lightly sprinkle the coarse sea salt over the crust. I didn't end up using the entire T, just lightly sprinkle evenly on top. You don't want them too salty.
- 5. Take the remaining dough out of the refrigerator and crumble over the top of the caramel. Return the pan to the oven and bake for 25-30 minutes until filling is bubbly and the top is firm. Let them cool completely before cutting.
