Caravan to Pioneer Harvest Fiesta

After the September Rally there will be a Caravan leaving Mountain View, AR. We will leave Mountain View AR. September 26th and arrive at Fort Scott, KS. September 30th.

September 26th we will travel approximately136 miles to Paradise Valley (PVR private membership campground) campground located on MO-112. It is seven miles south of Cassville behind Roaring River State Park #1. We will have full hookups.

Things to do: Trout fishing at Roaring River State Park. State Park has hiking trails.

Eureka Springs, AR. Approximately 25 miles away.

Rogers, AR., Approximately 25 miles away. Among other things is Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art.

Pea Ridge Civil War Battlefield, approximately 20 miles away.

Branson, MO., approximately 60 miles away.

Cassville, MO. has the Barry County Museum, Courthouse Square, Walmart Supercenter, Kings Food Saver grocery. They also have flea markets.

September 27th, Rick will smoke a pork loin for the evening meal 5 to 6 pm. Plan to fix a simple side dish to share if the pandemic settles down.

September 28th we will travel about 60 miles to the Downtown Casino RV Park at Joplin, Mo. They have Electric and water, and a dump station. No picnic tables. Price varies with a player card status with a maximum of \$25.00 per night.

Things to do in Coffeyville, KS.

Coffeyville, Kansas is famous for the Dalton Gang demise, October 5^{th,} 1892. This is where The Dalton Gang tried to hold up two banks (The Old Condon Bank and The First National Bank) at once, and where 4 of the 5 gang were killed. Eight citizens died in the battle. More on this at the Dalton Defenders and Coffeyville History Museum located at 814 S. Walnut St.

Old Condon Bank, located in the Perkins Building. This building has been restored to the condition at the of the Dalton Gang Raid.

Death Alley & Old City Jail, located West of Walnut St. The alley between 8th and 9th St. This is where The Dalton Gang Members tied up their horses, and where the raid ended. Be sure to put your quarters in the kiosk to hear the story and watch the jail light up. Be sure to check out the mural and watch the man in the green shirt he is watching you.

Ishim's, True Value Hardware Store, located 811 Union St. Isham's opened in 1870 and has had its doors open since. Be sure to stop by and hear some of the history of this iconic store.

The Elmwood Cemetery at 1701 Elmwood Dr. is the burial site of three members of The Dalton Gang and two defenders of the town. Just West of the gravesite is Frank Dalton's grave who was a brother. Frank was a US Marshall killed in the line of duty.

The Brown Mansion is located at South Walnut and Eldridge on US 169. This is a 20,000 square foot home built from 1898-1906 for a wholesale price of \$125,000. This historic home contains all the original furnishing.

There is also an Aviation Museum at 2002 N. Buckeye, Pfister Park, also several thrift stores and antique shops.

There is the Little House on the Prairie Museum at 2507 CR 3000, Independence Ks.

Safari Zoological Park at 1751A CR 1425, Caney, KS.

Pioneer Woman Rhee Drummond Mercantile is in Pawhuska, OK., at 532 Kihekah Ave. this is approximately 50 to 60 miles away from our campsite. More information in the October newsletter.
