

I was also our club delegate for the ITB meeting and represented the club voting on amendments. We passed three amendments to the Airstream International Club's constitution.

One of the amendments will change how we vote for international officers next year. Currently our trailers carry the big red numbers and technically they are voting for officers via a club delegate. In 2022 each member (main member and partner member) will get to cast their vote for international president and each vice president candidates. This may require you to login to the membership portal on the Airstream International Club website and make sure you and your member partners have an email address on file with the club. Instructions on how to vote and a link will be emailed directly to each member. I have looked at mine and Diane's, and I cannot see if she has an email address set up. Hopefully, correcting this should be as simple as opening a help ticket with the club IT team.

Also changing is when membership renewal will occur for members. Starting next year, some memberships will renew on the anniversary of the date you joined vs. year end. This will help spread out the work for HQ renewing membership throughout the year. For the most part, this change will only affect the "newer" members, as "older" members will continue to renew at the year end. It was encouraged that all members renew online to make it simpler for a club treasurer to manage. You can also renew your affiliate club memberships online.

Medina Railroad Museum https://orleanscountytourism.com/suggested-tours/ Start your railway tour at the Medina Railroad Museum, a 300' long freight house built in 1905, exhibiting railroad and firefighting history as well as housing the largest HO scale model railroad layout in the eastern US. Enjoy a leisurely 34-mile round trip, 2 hour themed excursion through the Erie Canal Heritage Corridor aboard a comfortable vintage passenger coaches between Medina & Lockport (reservations required).

In Albion, tour a church resembling a castle built by George Pullman, inventor of the rail sleeping car at East Park St., Albion (corner of N. Main St.). George Pullman (1831-1897), noted industrialist, was once a resident of Albion and later became the manufacturer of Pullman Railroad Cars. One of his local legacies is the Pullman Memorial Universalist Church in Albion, which he built in 1894 to honor his parents' memory. Includes several famed Tiffany Stained glass windows.

Country Barn Quilt Trail begins at Partyka Farms on Routes 272 & 18 just off the Seaway Trail. Pick up a map and step-on guide for a homespun tour of over 50 barn quilt patterns. The Barn Quilt Trail is about 21 miles long and takes a little over an hour to complete. Many of the quilt patterns have very interesting and sometime poignant backgrounds, with names like The Farmer's Daughter, Carpenter's Wheel, Circle the Field, and Joseph's Coat.

Cobblestone Trail on Ridge Road: The "Ridge" sits upon a ridge of sand once forming the shoreline of ancient Lake Iroquois before receding 10,000 years ago. It was first used by the Senecas and Iroquois, and in 1798 a road was traced through the forest near the ridge, transforming the trail into a stagecoach turnpike. Tillman's Village Inn at Childs is the only surviving stagecoach stop. The Ridge is often referred to as "the road of the cobblestone houses," for there are more such buildings along its 25 miles from Rochester

than on any highway in America. The <u>Cobblestone Museum</u> in Childs is the only cobblestone museum in the world. It show-cases the unique masonry construction method using stones rounded and polished into cobble by glacial action. The Iroquois National Wildlife Refuge (INWR) at 1101 Casey Rd, Basom (off Route 63 at the Genesee/Orleans County border) is over 10,800 acres of wooded swamp, marshland and meadows providing a stopping point for an estimated 100,000 Canada geese and 266 species of birds during their spring and fall migrations. Sixty species are considered year-round residents. Activities include nature trails, overlooks, photography blind (by permit), canoeing in designated areas, fishing, hunting (by permit) and cross country skiing/snowshoeing. The visitor center is open weekdays 7:30 AM-4 PM year-round and weekends 9 AM-5 PM spring and fall. Trails and overlooks are open sunrise to sunset, year-round. Fishing areas as are open from sunrise to sunset within state seasons.



The Great Lakes Seaway Trail is a 518-mile scenic driving route that follows the shores of Lake Erie, the Niagara River, Lake Ontario, and the St. Lawrence River in New York and Pennsylvania. Follow 25 miles along the Lake Ontario State Parkway and Route 18 in Orleans County. One of the first roads in America to be designated as a National Scenic Byway, the Great Lakes Seaway Trail includes unique historical locations such as the Oak Orchard Lighthouse in Point Breeze, cultural heritage sites as well as outstanding views and scenic vistas. Fish at the 2013 Ultimate Fishing Town of Point Breeze year-

round. Schedule a drive on Tuesday evenings in July & August for a concert series in the Orleans County Marine Park or catch a Shakespeare in the Park performance in August.

Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor

25 miles of the 360-mile Erie Canal cuts through Orleans County and includes 3 port villages: Medina, Albion & Holley. Year-round activities include:

- Hike or cycle the 25 mile stone dust towpath in Orleans County
- View the bluebirds at 180 nesting boxes in and around Albion
- Visit Holley Falls, Medina Falls & Aqueduct
- Drive under the Erie Canal at the Culvert
- When the water flows From Mid-April to mid-October, activities include canalside concerts and festivals at the ports of Holley, Albion & Medina. Boating canoeing, kayaking or stand up paddle boarding. Fishing for bass, catfish, carp, yellow perch, sunfish and more.

It was a great week and a great rally with many fun events taking place - the Grande Old Opry, food and ice cream vendors, entertainment, presentations, a dog show/ contest (unfortunately, we waited too long to enter our two), a flea market, many vendors, unit luncheons, and the installation of our new International Officers for next year. For those of you who do not already know - Tye Mott is our new International President. Anyone that knows Tye knows he will be an excellent president and will work tirelessly in his new position. For those that have not met Tye yet, I hope each of you gets the opportunity to meet and talk with him - you will be very impressed!

NYFLAC Donation to Airstream Heritage Center

Recently I was contacted by a club member and learned of a number of items that belonged to the club that he had been storing in his garage for the past 20+ years. Jack and Trina Kelly had boxes of club history in the form of scrapbooks, newsletters, books, pictures, and other items that were given to them to store when the Rochester unit merged with several other New York units.



The Kelly's met us at the Sampson Rally where we were able to look over the items. They had a 20-year history of the Rochester unit with scrapbooks filled with pictures from rallies, newspaper articles, hard copies of old newsletters (I guess they were all hard copied back then) - all were neatly preserved in binders with protective covers. There were also two year books from the 1976 and 1978 International Rallies.



Jack said that they were in the process of downsizing and before discarding anything he wanted to to see whether or not the club was interested in them. Not wanting to lose this history, but at the same time not wanting to

store these items for the next 20 years, I set about finding the proper home for them.

John Anderson volunteered to scan all the documents, pictures, and newsletters, so that the club would have access to the digital items for years to come. This still left me with the question of what to do with the physical items.

At the Lebanon Rally I met Samantha Martin, the Archivist and Historian for Airstream's new Heritage Center in Jackson Center and Joe Peplinski, our WBCCI historian. After telling them what the club had I asked if Airstream or WBCCI would be interested in these items. WBCCI does not have the space for the physical item but was interested in the digital copies of the scanned documents. Samantha said that Airstream would be very interested in all of the physical items.

I just happened to have the two International Rally yearbooks with me in our Airstream trailer and shared them with both of them. Joe said that he recently purchased similar books on Ebay that were not in as good condition. I agreed to donate both books to the Airstream Heritage Center and will donate the remainder of the documents once they have been scanned.

I want to thank Jack and Trina Kelly for keeping these items in such good condition all of these years. Hopefully, some day in the future



Region 2 News

I'm writing this at a KOA on our trip home from Lebanon. Several other Airstreams are at the same campground, including a few couples from the Central Pennsylvania club. There's so much to talk about and I hope I'm not blowing up everyone's newsletters. First, thank you, everyone, for the support you've shown Erica and I already. It was nice to meet so many of you and reconnect with old friends. We're looking forward to being able to sit down with you around a campfire.

Unfortunately, our Canadian members were unable to attend the rally. The Region 10 flag wasn't present; there was an empty spot in the flagpole holder. It was a constant reminder of our missing friends in Canada.

My prediction for a polar vortex didn't pan out, but at least we didn't see extreme temperatures like we had during the 2019 Doswell rally. Most days topped out around 90°F (~32°C), so it was hot, but survivable. Mornings tended to be in the high 60s (16°C), though the humidity was always over 90%. The electrical system at the rally site was excellent; we had no problems with the air conditioner shutting off unexpectedly.

The rally was great – I heard the final count was around 780 Airstreams, and many people were first-time International attendees (something like 30% of the people there were first timers). We met many new people and caught up with old friends, and we found some time to explore Nashville. Our dog Sulley had a great time with long walks, visits to the dog park, and meeting many other Airstreamers and their dogs. I think he loves Airstream rallies as much as we do...maybe more.

Our Region 2 luncheon was a huge success. We had great food and great giveaways. The raffle for the biggest prizes generated \$675 for the local animal shelter "A New Leash on Life". Your generosity really came through. The shelter was thrilled with the donation, and, as animal lovers, Erica and I thank you, too.

Please join me again in thanking Rich for his efforts; in addition to his efforts for our region, he chaired a committee to improve membership benefits – the Michelin tire discount, for example – so his work has improved the club's offerings for everyone. We presented Rich and Kathi with a gift and plaque at the luncheon.

Various motions were passed during the International Board of Trustees (IBT) meetings; most of them were not controversial and passed easily. Probably the most exciting was that the 2023 International Rally will be held in Rock Springs, Wyoming, from about June 24 to about July 2. (Speaking of International rallies, registration for next year's rally in Fryeburg, Maine is now open. The dates of the rally are July 23-29, 2022.)

The one controversial topic was a motion to prevent the WBCCI from requiring proof of vaccination (or proof of exemption) for any event. This mostly affected caravans that are traveling between multiple jurisdictions and dealing with differing local requirements. Members submitted valid arguments for and against the policy, and although the motion passed, it was not a unanimous decision. The IBT felt that they had to clarify as much as they could, to avoid having the burden fall on event planners. The caravans will follow local or CDC guidelines, whichever is more restrictive.

One item brought for discussion (only – not voted upon) was changing the International positions to two years, instead of the current one-year term, and eliminating the 3rd VP position. Various members of the club had great arguments for and against this suggestion, so it wasn't immediately clear what was best for the club. President Tye Mott will appoint a committee to look into it and report back.

Now that International has ended, I am turning my attention to other things, including the Region 2 rally for 2022. Multiple people have offered suggestions and preferences, and I thank you for that feedback. My first goal is to nail down the dates and location, so that we can get them on everyone's calendars. More information will be forthcoming in my future notes.

There's so much more I could say about the last week or two, but I've taken up enough space in everyone's newsletters. Thanks for your time, and we'll see you down the road!

A Bit of Constitutional and Bylaws Housekeeping (Simplified Version)

At the 2021 International Rally (IR) delegates approved three amendments to the WBCCI Constitution which will require local clubs to amend their Constitutions and Bylaws to be consistent with those of WBCCI.

- Beginning in 2022 **EACH** member will be able to vote directly by electronic or mail ballot for the WBCCI International Officers. (Historically there was only 1 vote per registered household.) There will no longer be a need for IR delegate to represent local club voting.
- Proposed amendment changes to the WBCCI Constitution **WILL** continue to require a Constitutional Delegates Meeting. Delegates from each local club will represent the vote of their club membership on amendments allowing for discussion on proposed amendments.
- To address these changes each local club will need to amend their Constitution and Bylaws to reflect the changes made by the International Board of Trustees (IBT). A copy of the revised model was attached to this email.
- The IBT also voted to allow any member of WBCCI (regular or member at large) to become an affiliate of a local club. Our club Constitution needs to reflect this change as well.
- The IBT has changed membership renewal date for **new members** effective 8/1/202 to the date they join. As a result, bylaws for local clubs must be updated. All **legacy members** who joined prior to 8/1/2021 continue to have a December 31 anniversary date.
- **ALL members** will renew their membership through Headquarters or Airstream Club International (ACI) for International, local and affiliate dues. This results in some changes in the duties of the Local Club Treasurer and should be incorporated into Local Club Bylaws.

Local Clubs who are not due (NYFLAC is NOT due this year) for review should make sure the changes are incorporated into their documents now. Remember, changes in your Constitution require approval of the Membership.
