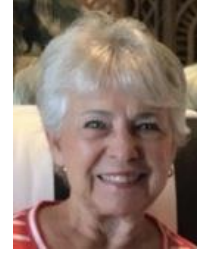

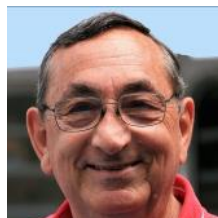

## ***Emilio & Shirley's Trip to Mackinaw Island and Sault Ste Marie Michigan, 3500 Mile, 22 Days***

Our first stop was McDonough, GA. 430 miles North of Tampa at the Atlanta South Rv Resort located thirty miles south of Atlanta, GA. The traffic in Atlanta is difficult to navigate so the next morning we started out early on our way to Georgetown, Kentucky and stayed at the Whispering Hills Rv Resort for our second night. We continued our trip north to Frankenmuth, Michigan where we stayed at the Yogi Bear Jellystone Park.

Frankenmuth Michigan is a Bavarian style town with beautiful flowers decorating Main Street. There is a great Military Museum, many specialty shops, restaurants, and outdoor vendors that make shopping and sightseeing wonderful. Frankenmuth also has the largest Christmas store in the world and the residents are proud in celebrating Christmas every day of the year. We recommend a visit to Frankenmuth if traveling in Michigan.



The third day of our trip we arrived in Mackinaw City and stayed at the KOA where we had a wonderful seven-night stay. We met other Air Streamers at the park including an interesting person from New Jersey traveling with his grandson. He was towing his 25 ft Airstream with his 1963 GMC pickup truck with over 300K miles on it. His business is repairing industrial baking and pizza ovens and at the same time recording and writing about his travels with his grandson throughout the USA. When we all meet at our next rally ask to see pictures of this vintage truck and airstream – it is a hoot! The next day we traveled via ferry to Mackinaw Island. The weather in northern Michigan was a perfect 70 degrees during the day and 62 degrees at night. Taking a horse and buggy tour of the island was a perfect way to see the island's points of interest and historical landmarks. The tour stopped at the Grand Hotel where we had a great lunch.

We took a day trip north from Mackinaw City to Salt Ste Marie where the US and Canadian border is located. Travel into Canada was not permitted due to Covid 19 restrictions, so we stopped at the border. We visited The Maritime Locks in Salt Ste Marie which connect Lake Erie, Superior, and Huron facilitating maritime travel through the Great Lakes.

Another day was spent at Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historic Park and the Wright Brothers Cycle Shop. We spent some time in Mount



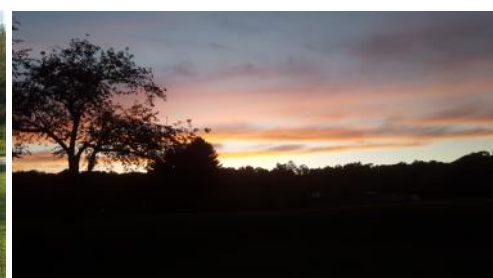
Blanchard, a town of 500 people in the middle of farm land. They grow corn and soy beans. We even enjoyed the experience of a Friday

## My Airstream Mother by Barbara Colson



Ruth Wilson was a member of the South Florida Airstream Unit from about 1973 and a lifetime member of the WBCCI to the day she died on August 14th, 2021. She was the first woman president of the South FL Unit and she did it twice. Once in 1984 and again in 2002. She was a former Marine serving at the end of World War II as a riveter on C47's in CA. She was married to her high school boyfriend who was also in the Marines. My father had always wanted an Airstream after reading an article about Wally Byam leading a group of trailers through Africa.

Thus, the beginning of their life together as Airstreamers. They attended several Airstream International Rallies and always volunteered for some job, better, closer parking for volunteers.

One of the first caravans my parents took was through Mexico with 300+ units in the 70's. They were to keep a low profile, which would seem pretty impossible. My parents went on several caravans and were the mail people on a caravan through western Canada. In those days, caravans were rather large. My grandmother went on the Canadian caravan with them and enjoyed passing out the mail to the folks on the caravan. After my father passed away in 1996 (about 10 days later), mother went out and bought herself a brand new 30' Airstream Land Yacht Motorhome which she towed a little Plymouth Neon behind. (My father told her she would be broke and on the streets within a year. This was her solution to that problem.) Oh, the stories she could tell!

Mother was also chairman of the Usherettes in Sarasota for a number of years at the State Rally held there every February. She also organized the activities and tours for the Orange Bowl Rally held in Miami for several years. She loved traveling. She continued to do rallies after my father passed. One rally, I remember was out west that had her driving on the loneliest road in the US, somewhere in Nevada. She did the Lighthouse Caravan in New England, went on the New Newfoundland Caravan as well as the Polar Bear Caravan in Canada. On the Polar Bear Caravan she actually saw a C47 totally put together. Some caravans and rallies she would con her friend, Ruby Hunsaker or me into going with her. Other trips she would pack it up and head out by herself. Traveling with the caravan made it a safer way for her to travel. Her children didn't worry so much about her when she had someone to travel with. Like we really could have stopped her anyway.

One of our (Ruth and my) first trips in her new Airstream motorhome was across the country to Vancouver, Canada. We left Florida, shortly after school was out for me that summer in June. We traveled to some amazing places along the way. We visited friends; stopped in Branson, MO camping in a city park right on the river; went white water rafting in Canyon City, CO; spent 10 days at Mt Hood enjoying the area while resting for my sister and her family to catch up with us, drove to Vancouver, Canada to take a cruise to Alaska; visited Victoria Island; traveled back across Canada stopping at Lake Louise, Banff, and the Columbia Icefields; drove to the Mall of America in MN. Mother continued on to NY, then traveled down to SC before arriving back at Traveler's Rest by herself. I had to fly back to Tampa to go back to teaching. In the ten years mom owned her motorhome, she put 100,000 miles on it. She was an amazing woman, overcoming several obstacles throughout her life. Being the eighth child of 11 children, Ruth was the first to graduate from high school in her family. She wanted teachers her older brothers and sisters didn't have. As a child for a short time her family ended up living in the barn since the house burned down just before they could move into it. She married my dad in 1946 and in 1952, he came down with polio and was a disabled paraplegic for the remainder of their 50 year marriage before dad passed.

Small in stature, this woman was mighty. I don't think I ever saw her fall apart or let life get her down. She always picked herself back up and tried a new adventure. She was very friendly and never met a stranger. She taught me the value of volunteering and helping others, besides being independent. I will miss her dearly and hopefully can follow in her footsteps.

Joseph "Joe" F. Bova age 93 lost his struggle with cancer on August 29, 2021. His life revolved around love of family, good food/drink, travel and service to others. Until the very end, Joe's memory was impressive. He loved to socialize and recalled details long after visits. His outgoing personality served him well in his community where he held leadership roles in the Boy Scouts of America and volunteered with the National Parks Service. During the past 18 years, Joe lived at Normandy Farms Estates in Blue Bell, PA volunteering on the culinary committee and as president of the NFE Residents Association. Joe was born on October 3, 1927 in New Rochelle, NY, first-son of Joseph P. and Irma B. Bova. He was a

long-time resident of St. Davids, PA, and Dade City, FL. During World War II, Joe served in both the NY - Army National Guard and the U.S. Army Medical Corps. A 1946 graduate of J.P. McCaskey High School, Lancaster, PA, Jack traveled with a local carnival, as Master of Ceremonies and sound technician, immediately upon graduation.

Later, Jack worked for Lancaster's largest department store, Watt and Shand, as a stock boy, before entering the United States Army Signal Corps as a Private in January 1948. He retired after 22 years of active service with the rank of Lt. Colonel.
