To Switch or Not to Switch

Since 1990 we have owned 4 Airstream and a small Winnebago. Every time we switched it was for a newer model or a larger unit. Our last upgrade was to a 2009 25ft Flying Cloud with twin beds. Just the unit we love! Two years ago, we had trouble with the hot water unit. We could not get a hot shower! During 2020 there was no camping and so no need for repairs. This year, things were looking up and we brought the Flying Cloud to Colonial for those needed hot water repairs. I read about on demand hot water units one called AquaGo Comfort and it replaced the old-fashioned gas hot water furnace. Colonial told me they could instill this new unit but it had to be a special order which could take 4 weeks to be shipped from the supplier and an additional week to install.

On July 10th we picked up our trailer with the upgraded hot water system and was ready to start the camping season! Trailer ready, tow vehicle read, Occupants...Not so ready. Ever since the pandemic I have had problems with my urinary tract. Frequently having to stop to go to the bathroom plays havoc with my driving ability.

While on a camping trip, I have the bathroom with me but when I'm driving it's not in the truck, it is in the trailer behind us. By the time I can stop, walk to the rear of the trailer, unlock it, and make it to the bathroom, it's too late. I need my bathroom closer. The only way to do this is to switch to a Class B or Class C motorhome. Easier said than done, because we have to trade in our Flying Cloud. This will be an opportunity for a club member to upgrade to a larger or newer unit. We cannot switch until we have sold our current unit. Meanwhile, camping is delayed, again.

Camping Recipes

Life with Pie Iron. It's now cool enough that having an evening campfire is a necessity and not just a lovely way to wind down. For me, I love to use our pie iron for sandwiches and treats! If you don't have one, check out a <u>Rome Pie Iron at REI</u>. Simple rules for a pie iron are to butter bread of choice to line the pie iron (butter sides down) and fill with anything you want! I like dessert the best and LOVE Monkey Bread so try these out!

This was super delicious, but burns easily. Go slow and keep turning, checking often as the sugars can easily burn if you aren't careful. But once you learn how, it is worth repeating.



Ingredients

- 2 rounds of refrigerated biscuit dough, cut into quarters
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- Butter
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon pecans, chopped

Instructions

- 1. Combine the cinnamon and sugar in a small bowl.
- 2. Melt a little butter in your iron, covering both sides.
- 3. Sprinkle your brown sugar in the butter and add your pecans.
- 4. Roll each biscuit dough quarter into cinnamon sugar and place in pie iron on top of the brown sugar and pecans. Close and cook until the dough has puffed up and has turned lightly brown.

During the day Saturday, we had time to explore the area. Some went to the County Fair and others to the Red Hook Aerodrome for an air show. So much to do in this area!


Saturday night happy hour started at 4 and went until late in the night as there was so much catching up to do.
