Part of the trip was the drive itself over the Sierras via Tioga Pass (CA-120) through Yosemite to get to the Eastern Sierra Valley. We were struck by the beauty on this Pass. We stopped for a view of a lake and ended up having lunch at the roadside.

I expect that my surprise about the Eastern Valley will be no surprise to Central Coast and LA-area people: It's a popular destination, even during pandemic times! My first choice for campground was Mammoth Mountain RV Park. I visited their website to reserve a site but found no availability which I thought strange since I was looking to arrive on a Sunday and leave on

We happened to find Bass Lake one night on a walk and the kids rented a kayak there the next day and found a new sport. We used June Lake as home-base for visiting Devil's Postpile in Mammoth and Manzanar Internment Camp in Independence, Bodie ghost town, and Mono Lake. Tip: if you love Mexican food, make sure to eat at Roberto's Café

in Mammoth. Café really isn't the right word for this place. You will get a huge plate of food. I highly recommend the whole beans instead of refried as a side. I will eat here every time I visit from now on.
