It was a beautiful week with sunshine every day, which made our outdoor activities possible, especially the Day in the Park.



Sugarcreek: Immersion in the Amish/Mennonite Lifestyle By Kat Hibbard

Dale and I attended the 58th Annual Swiss Festival Annual rally from September 25th to October 3rd in Sugarcreek, Ohio. It was our first big national/international rally and the longest rally we've attended so far; the others being weekend events.







As told to us by long-time members, the West Virginia Club, our hosts, built a small pavilion in the park for use by the community the rest of the year.

Usually an open, covered space, the large pavilion for evening programs, is transformed for the rally into a closed building by adding sides and doors.



The Winkelpleck Grove campground is normally electric-only, but the club volunteer water crew tapped in to buried water points and ran hundreds of yards of plastic pipe so we could all have water! The electric crew installed special outlets which allowed us to have shared 7amp power. At the end of the rally a crew of volunteers removed all of this infrastructure, packed it up and put it into the storage rooms in the back of the pavilion. Amazing!

Saturday, we arrived, set up and were treated to an Amish speaker who told us about their culture and lifestyle followed by about 20 Amish youth acapella singers. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday we had a choice of tours to Amish/Mennonite businesses in Sugar Creek and neighboring towns. And each evening there was entertainment at the pavilion.

Thursday was "Day in the Park." A crew of club members cooked bean soup over fires in huge cast iron kettles, while an Amish couple made apple butter in another large kettle nearby. A bus load of Amish children and their teachers came for lunch and to visit our campground. The kids were treated to golf cart rides and some even got to drive.

Dale rode in the sidecar of a Royal Enfield motorcycle and an Amish gentleman came with his buggy and standard bred horse to give us rides.

Friday and Saturday were Swiss Festival Days in Sugarcreek with a parade on Saturday.

On Sunday we said goodbye to our old and new friends and rolled on down the road to our next adventure.
