

Dear Rivet, I am planning to store my Airstream until warmer weather. What do I need to do to prepare? Chilly N. Corsicana

First remove all food items, paper and cardboard from closets and cabinets. We don't want to encourage winter guests (rodents). Leave cabinet, closet and cabinet doors open when storing for better circulation and humidity control. Wash your Airstream before storing, especially the roof. Washing the roof will let you inspect for any water leaks, loose or cracked sealants or any damage to AC covers or vents. Drain your water lines and tanks. Fill them with antifreeze. Use only RV non-toxic antifreeze. Your local RV store will have the supplies needed. About 2 gallons will do the trick. With over 37 registered rigs our business meeting was well attended Saturday morning.








New Owner Weekend Workshops

WBCCI MEMBER UPDATE

New Airstream Club Voting Procedures Requires Your Attention

The Airstream Club's International Board of Trustees have approved a new voting procedure for International Officers and any proposals that require approval of the club's membership beginning next year (2022). Previously, each unit president or their delegate would vote their unit's votes on these items at the IBT delegates meeting at the International Rally. Beginning in 2020, these issues will be determined by a direct vote of the membership, with the primary member and their spouse/partner each getting a vote. The vote will be done by email and both the primary member, and the spouse will need to have separate email addresses on file with the Airstream Club to get a ballot.

The easiest way to determine if you have a separate email on file with the Airstream Club for your spouse/partner for your BRN is to go to the Airstream Club.org website and log onto your members section using the email that is used by the Airstream Club to contact you. If you forgot your password or if this is the first time you are logging onto the members section of the website, click on "forgot email" on the log in page, type in the email address you have on file with the Airstream Club. After submitting the form, you will receive an email that has a link that will take you to a webpage where you set up a new password. Once you are logged into to the members section, click on the members directory and look up your name. For members who have not put in a separate email for the spouse/partner, the club has put in a filler email in that space. Initially, the club simply added a 1 to the primary members email address before the @. (Johndoe@gmail.com became Johndoe1@Gmail.com for the spouse/partner) Lately, they have used NoemailBRN+@airstreamclub.org for the filler email.

If you need to set up an email for your spouse/partner you must contact the Airstream Club at Jackson Center at 937-596-5211 and give them the email address for the spouse/partner. You will then need to go to the log in page and use the "forgot password option" to receive an email that allows you to set up a password for the spouse/partner.

Lastly, if you have problems getting a spouse/email set up, contact Tom Bundy, Region 9 Communications Chair at 281-250-7644 to get help.



Be sure to renew your WBCCI Membership before December 31st

For members who joined before July 1, 2021, membership renewal with the Wally Byam Airstream Club is now due. You can renew online at www.AirstreamClub.org or by calling headquarters at 937-596-5211. You need to renew by the end of 2021 to get your name in the 2022 directory. If you joined on or after July 1, 2021, your membership fee will be due 12 months from the date you joined. There are many benefits for members such as a discount on tires. This website also gives you access to your members only section by clicking on login in the upper right hand corner. 
Myron Fischer is recovering from eye surgery. We missed seeing Myron and Kathryn at the recent Christmas Rally.


