Zephyr Travels and Wanderings

During our recent stay at Picacho Peak State Park, we decided to visit one of the local attractions "Rooster Cogburn Ostrich Ranch". Fortunately for us, it was not very far from the campground, so we were able to ride our bikes. We could even have walked if we were real ambitious - but we weren't!

There was an admission fee of \$12.00, plus if you wanted to feed the stingrays, that was an additional \$3.00 - which we did. Once you paid the admission fee, you were given 2 cups - one full of food pellets to feed the donkeys, the deer, the ostriches, and the goats, plus a second one containing a small cup of nectar to feed the birds, a piece of asparagus to feed the tortoises, 3 coins to purchase food for the rabbits and the ducks, and 2 additional chips to purchase food for the stingrays.





The first stop was the donkeys who just loved the food that we fed them - you put the food in the palm of your hand and all the donkeys just gently eat the food from there. The same was true for the deer and the goats. Also in the park was another system used to feed the goats where the goats were placed in an enclosed "Goat Penthouse"

located many feet off the ground and a conveyor belt system with small cups where food was placed and run up on a conveyor belt and dumped for the goats to eat. To feed the ostriches, you placed the food pellets in metal containers attached to the inside of the fence - there the ostriches scrambled to get some of the food - it was a real frenzy!!





Our next stop was the huge pen where the rabbits lived the food for them was purchased with one of the coins that was given to you. Some of the
rabbits were sleeping, but the ones that were not were very happy to hop over to the fence and
gently take the food from you - only one piece at a time! We
stayed there for quite a while as the bunnies were so cute!

After the bunnies, we went to where the birds are kept - I'm pretty sure they knew that anyone entering the area had a treat for them and soon I had two very pretty birds land on me ready to eat up the nectar that was in the little cup - I have to admit that I was quite startled when they first landed on me - the same thing happened to Randy! Our next stop was the pond where the ducks were swimming - to feed them, we used another coin to purchase their food. The method you were told to use to feed the ducks seemed quite simple, but these ducks seemed guite hungry attempting to eat our fingers as well as



quite simple, but these ducks seemed quite hungry attempting to eat our fingers as well as their food, so we simply just tossed the food at them and into their pond!!



Following the duck pond, we headed over to the tortoise pen - their food was the piece of asparagus. Now I have to tell you, these tortoises have an extremely strong bite! If you wanted to, you could go right inside the tortoise pen, but we chose to stay on the outside.

Our final stop was the pool where the stingrays live, and like I said, you pay a little extra to feed them. I don't remember the name of these stingrays, but they were small. Randy was a bit more daring about feeding them - I'm not sure where my food went!

We really enjoyed our visit to the ranch which is open year round. We visited during the off season in November so it wasn't too busy. The ranch is located north of Tucson right off of Interstate 10 on your way to Phoenix!
