

President's Corner



NORVA members asked to vote in special election this month

In mid-December, NORVA President Ronald Raymond, whose term of office began last September, informed the club's Executive Board he was resigning. He and his wife, Chris, decided to become WBAC members-atlarge.

NORVA's Constitution provides for quickly filling a presidential void by directing that "the next ranking vice president shall succeed to that office."

(Article IV, Sect. 3). Because the position of 1st vice president is vacant the club's 2nd vice president, should move up to the position of President. I therefore have agreed to succeed to the office of president for the balance of the term.

Gerry Nagel, who is NORVA's immediate past president, formed a nominating committee to identify candidates to fill the positions of 1st and 2nd vice president.

Most of the duties of the two open positions have already been accomplished this year. The 1st VP, responsible for managing the club's rally schedule, will find a majority of NORVA's 2022 events have been set. The 2nd VP, whose principal job is to plan the club caravan, won't have to do that because my wife, Elizabeth, and I are leading NORVA's caravan to Maine in June.

In keeping with NORVA's Bylaws, the nominating committee "shall place in nomination one candidate for each office to be filled by election." All NORVA members eligible to vote in this special election should have received an e-mail announcing the names of the candidates. Shortly thereafter, an e-mail ballot was sent to each member-household eligible to vote (one household=one vote; Affiliate members cannot vote). Voting was accomplished by replying to the e-mail. A subsequent e-mail to all members announced the election results.

Congratulations and thank you to 1st VP, Sue Shepard, and 2nd VP Priscilla Harrell. This opened the position of Newsletter Editor (shared by Gary and Susan Shepard), in keeping with NORVA's Bylaws "Vacancies which occur in the offices of Newsletter Editor, Secretary, Treasurer, Webmaster, Legislative Director, and Membership Director shall be filled by a majority vote of the Executive Board". The Executive Board has unanimously voted David Harrell to fill the position of Newsletter Editor.

Now that these officer positions have been filled, we can return to thinking about the upcoming rallies and caravans planned for 2022 and considering maintenance repairs and modification to your Airstream getting ready for the spring camping season.

One last note. To increase comradery and spirit within NORVA, we are currently securing a local printer to do some "quick and easy" on demand work for NORVA Events. We plan to offer a variety of club and rally t-shirts, ball caps and other swag. Keep an eye out for upcoming ordering options.







Next, we will make our way to Searsport Shores Campground, Searsport, Maine, located about 150 feet from Penobscot Bay. Using the Searsport Campground as our base for six days, we will take scheduled trips up and down the Maine coast in pursuit of the perfect lobster and clam chowder. Once the caravan is over, interested campers may then caravan with us 135 miles to the WBCCI International Rally in Fryeburg, Maine, or return home.

Searsport Shores Bayside Campground on the Penobscot Bay

The following events are included in the itinerary:

- A day trip to the Owls Head Transportation Museum and lighthouse, the fishing village of Tenants Harbor, and Port Clyde.
- A day trip to Camden and Rockport harbors, and a 40-mile view from the top of Mt. Battie.
- A four-hour sailing trip on a 60' sloop/schooner in the Penobscot Bay (see note below).
- A day trip to the Farnsworth Museum in Rockland to see the Andrew Wythe collection and eat lobster rolls by the lighthouse museum.
- A day trip to Fort Knox (1845) and the Bucksport Bridge Observation tower (420' – 360-degree view of Verona Island).
- A day trip to the Schoodic National Seashore Park, the beautiful but lesser-known part
 of the Acadia National Park.
- A day trip to Castine, Maine A beautiful 1800s seaport village occupied by four different countries from 1750 to 1820. We will visit a fine museum, the home of the Maine Maritime Academy and an 1812 British earthen fort.
- The Penobscot Marine Museum in historic Searsport (as time allows).

Here are some additional details:

Utility Services: The Searsport Campground provides electricity and water hookups. They also have a honey wagon – you get one free pump-out during the week, and they have a dump station to use when you leave.

Pets: The Searsport Campground allows pets on leash. It does not allow pets to be left in campers during the day while we are out sightseeing. Sturbridge Village does not allow pets and leaving pets in cars in the summer is not a good idea.

Sailing Trip: The sailing trip will be on the beautiful Penobscot Bay and is usually not a choppy ride. The sailing sloop holds a maximum of 22 persons. Since everyone can not fit on one trip, we will charge separately for the sailing and make reservations for the first 22 that register to sail. The cost is \$80/person to be added above the kitty fee.

the first 15 registrants may contact the campsites directly, make their reservations, and attend the Maine day trips at their own expense. We will develop a waiting list for those who sign up past the first 15.

RALLY FEES - \$435 for an RV On-Site with 30 amp electric, water, and pump-outs; \$130 for each Adult (18+); \$40 for each Youth 13-17; Free for Children (12 & Under).

ADA ACCESSIBLE PARKING - Special parking, if requested, is near the central rally area for members. We ask that you bring your government/state-issued placard or supporting documentation with you to the rally.

REGISTRATIONS - Through the courtesy of Airstream, Inc., members registered before the start of the rally are entered into a prize drawing. Over \$2,000 in gift certificates for parts and service will be given away. Registrants must be present at the Airstream presentation to win.

STAGING AREA - In an attempt to keep the rigs moving, you will receive a rally arrival date in the Spring of 2022. 

PROTECT YOUR TRAILER TIRES - Most NORVAU members are carefully cleaning and storing their recreational equipment to insure that it stays in proper condition for next season. The Tire Industry Safety Council suggests the same careful storage of recreational vehicle tires for the same reason; a head start on a trouble-free Spring and Summer. The Council offers these tips on tire storage to recreational webicle owners:

Remove the wheels from the vehicle, thus taking the weight off the tires.

2. Reduce the air pressure to 10 pounds;

3. Clean tires and remove bits of glass, etc., from the tread. Store the tires in a cool, dry place away from the sun and electrical equipment. (Ozone produced by electric anters tends to cause rubber deterioration.)

If wheel removal isn't feasible, the vehicle should be placed on blocks er jacks to take the weight off the tires, and the tires then deflated to 10 pennds pressure.

In preparing my own trailer, I merely jacked up each side of the trailer and placed stabilizing "stack jacks" under each axle end as near to the brake assembly as possible, using wooden pads to keep the stack jack frames from sinking into the ground. This whole operation, including deflating the tires, took only 30 minutes.

Those who followed the suggestion in the August, 1971, HaX and obtained a small inexpensive spark plug tire pump can use it for re-inflating the trailer tires when needed. Otherwise, the wheels and tires can be taken to a service station next Spring for inflation to the correct pressure. (Don't try to pump up those tires manually.....we don't want to lose any HCRVAU members!) Refer to your Owner's Manual for proper trailer jacking points to use and the correct tire inflation pressure for your trailer.

TREAM GALLEY RECIPE BY EILEEN

This dish was enjoyed at our Dogwood Rally:

Oriental Chicken & Rice from the recipe file of ELIZABETH CADLE

2 chicken breasts h chicken thighs

1/4 tsp. salt 1/8 tsp. whits pepper

2 1/2 oz. sliced mushrooms

1 5-oz. package Chicken Rice-A-Roni

1 can water chestnuts (optional) 1 small onion

Cover chicken with mater; add onion, salt and pepper; cook 'til tender. Remove the chicken and cut into small pieces. Cook Chicken Rice-A-Romi as directed on the package, substituting 3/4 cup chicken broth for 3/4 cup water. When Rice-A-Romi is ready, add chicken, mushrooms and chestnuts (which you slice very thin) and toss with a fork 'til mixed. Note: If you like it more moist, add a little chicken broth before serving.
