Welcome to the 2022 Oregon Airstream Club Rally Book

This year, your OAC board again decided to print this book for reference while you plan your camping season. We hope that you enjoy perusing what we have planned for you for 2022.

The rallies are spread across the states of Oregon, Washington, and California. Three rallies will be cohosted with other clubs – the Washington Airstream club will share the Wine Country Rally, Inland NW club will share Elk Meadows and NorCal will share Rambling Redwoods. There are boondocking rallies and a few back-to-back rallies, so you can choose to travel longer.

There are new places where we've never camped together before and some old standbys we enjoy again and again. Casey's is a good example. Some rallies are longer, like the Kite Rally, the Ashland Rally, and Pendleton Round-Up, and the Eastern Oregon tour. While others are a simple weekend like April Fools. We hope there is something for everyone.

Unlike previous years, if you pay for the rally by a check, please send it directly to the OAC Treasurer and not the host. After you sign up online you will be able to pay for multiple rallies with one check. Just enclose a note with rally information. PayPal payments are still available.

We have a few rallies that will be reserved later, and members will be notified as details are defined. For example, South Beach Kids/Family, Smoker Cook Off at Champoeg, Octoberfest at Lincoln Rock and Year-End rally locations.

Cancellation Policies

We know that things come up. For greatest clarity, here are the rally cancellation policies for our club.

Basically, if a cancellation incurs a cost, you will absorb that cost.

Each host will know the specific cancellation policies for their rally, and they can help you. If you need to cancel, please do so as soon as you know about a conflict so someone on the waiting list can take your spot. If you need to cancel, please don't give your spot to someone else, on your own, as there may be people who have been on the waiting list for a site.

Food

Unlike the previous years, food is not included in the rally fees. Each host will decide on meals and prices per rally. If hosts decide to provide meals, you will hear from them directly. Participating in meals is optional and any cost will be defined at that time.

Rally Registration

Registration for the 2022 Rallies will open in mid-January. When the registration opening gets set, all members will receive an email stating registration opening date and time. Our hosts will be able to register for the two rallies of their choice the day before as a thank you for hosting, and only their registrations will be accepted on that date.

You will have an opportunity to register and pay online via Pay Pal. This is easiest for our treasurer. However, if you prefer, you can send a check as payment to the treasurer Stacey Rovinelli (13606 NW 42nd Ave, Vancouver, WA, 98685)

Some rallies are very popular and fill quickly so best not to delay and sign up on the day registration opens if possible. If the rally you want is full, please contact the host and ask to be placed on the waiting list. Often people on the waiting lists can secure spots, so don't be discouraged. We have provided the phone number and email of each rally host so feel free to reach out to them with questions or concerns.

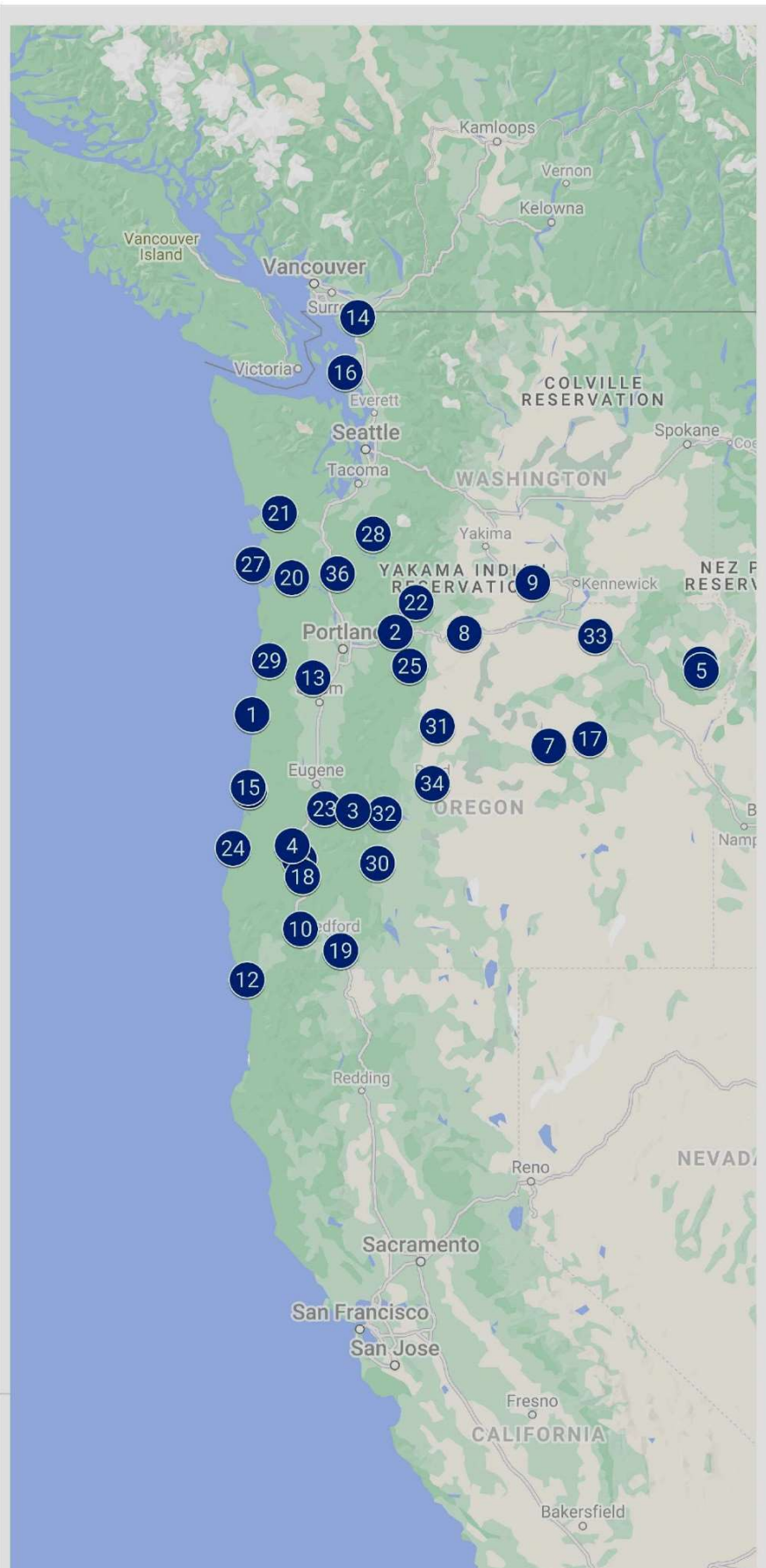

Situated between the south end of a scenic glacial lake and the towering peaks of the Wallowa Mountains, Wallowa Lake State Park is an ideal base camp for wilderness treks and watersports fun. The surrounding community at Wallowa Lake is reminiscent of a Swiss alpine village. It features a tramway to the top of 8,200-foot Mt. Howard with views of the Wallowa Lake basin and the Eagle Cap Wilderness. Several cultural sites and significant landmarks are also nearby. Hat Point Overlook, 54 miles northeast, overlooks the Snake River’s Hells Canyon, the deepest gorge in North America. Joseph Canyon Viewpoint is 42 miles north of the park.

Large open areas allow us to make group campfires and social distance if we still need to do that. Friends Landing is approximately one hour from Ocean Shore or Olympic National Park and Lake Quinalt. See the waterfall and visit historic Quinalt Lodge. Go for a hike but check ahead: pets not permitted on certain trails in National Parks. Check out the lovely Lake Sylvia State Park.
