Recipe Corner—These two recipes were made by Zephyr Marek at the rally and sound delicious for sure!!

Biscuits & Gravy Casserole

Ingredients:

1 pound sausage

1 ½ ounces of pork gravy mix (1 package of Pioneer brand Peppered Sausage Gravy Mix)

1 cup Cheddar Cheese, Shredded

6 eggs

½ cup milk

Salt to taste

Black Pepper to taste

1 can (8oz) biscuits (Pillsbury Grand Biscuits)

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degree's. Take a 9X13 pan and spray it with Pam or what ever you use.
- 2. Cut biscuits in to 1" pieces & line bottom of pan.
- 3. Brown the sausage and scatter over the biscuits. Sprinkle with cheddar cheese.
- 4. Whisk eggs and milk with a pinch of salt and pepper and pour them over the biscuits.
- 5. Make gravy mix per package directions and pour over eggs. Bake in the oven for about 30-45 minutes.

Crustless Quiche

Crustless Quiche Base Ingredients

6 eggs

1 cup milk (sometimes I use ½ cup milk and ½ cup half and half cream

1 cup cheese (cheddar, swiss cheese or mozzarella)

2 tbsp parmesan cheese (optional)

Salt & pepper to taste

1 cup additional ingredients (if mix-n-match make sure it equals 1 cup):

Cubed ham or crumbled bacon

Chopped broccoli

Chopped tomatoes

Sliced onions or green onions

Chopped Spinach

Chopped Asparagus

Cooked cubed Potato

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. In large bowl whisk together the milk, egg, cheese and salt & pepper
- 3. Stir in any additional optional ingredients you wish
- 4. Pour the egg mixture into a 9 inch pie pan, and bake uncovered for about 45 minutes. Or until the center is set, and not jiggly
