

Thursday, March 31st – Sunday, April 3rd Rally Host – Skip & Denny Crowe

Join us as we "Trot Into Tryon" for our first urban rally in the historic and quaint downtown district of Tryon, NC. Several CAC members local to Tryon have partnered with the Tryon Downtown Development Association to plan this fun and exciting M.O.R.E (Member Organized Rallies & Events) rally. Located in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, the downtown district of Tryon, NC boasts many local restaurants and businesses for us to support and enjoy while spending the weekend. We will meet on the Thursday evening of the rally at Harmon Park which is located just outside of downtown. On Friday morning we will parade as a group into downtown showing off our shiny Airstreams for all the local residents of Tryon to come out and see.

This will be a boondocking rally limited to a total of 25 rigs so be sure to sign up early to guarantee your spot. Since we are boondocking, you will also want to make sure your freshwater tank is topped off and ready when you arrive. More details for those that sign up will be sent out once plans are finalized.

New Bern Rally Clarification

Thinking about the New Bern Rally in the Fall? The CAC rally lists indicates the registration deadline is April 1, 2022. As a point of clarification, the KOA is holding sites only until April 1.... just 6 more sites as of the end of January. But they will continue to take reservations as long as sites are available. So, if your schedule does not permit you to make a commitment yet, you will need to decide by April 1. However, campgrounds have become busier, and campers are making reservations much earlier than in past years. Go ahead and contact the New Bern KOA to make a reservation, telling them you are with CAC, and then please RSVP to the host on the CAC web page.

With the beautiful cool weather calling us to hit the road with our Airstream, it's time to get ready for those upcoming rallies. Last month's newsletter had a brief checklist of "De-winterizing your rig". This list is a more detailed. Visit this link to see all the details around this detailed list.

- 1. Inspect and clean the exterior
- 2. Check Tires
- 3. Charge or replace batteries
- 4. Flush Water System
- 5. Sanitize Water System
- 6. Check the roof for any cracks or repairs needed
- 7. Clean the interior
- 8. Check for leaky pipes
- 9. Inspect propane system
- 10. Other Maintenance Checks
- Electric appliances Clean all your devices and test them in electric mode. Check the outer covers of your water heater and refrigerator for debris and clean them.
- Dump hoses The last thing you want to discover when dumping waste is a leaky dump hose. Check your sewage dump hose for any holes or leaks. Have them repaired or replaced immediately.
- Check engine For motorized camper trailers, check the fluid levels and top up where necessary. Make sure that all engine lights and controls are operational. Fill the engine with fresh fuel and a fuel additive (optional).
- Change/Clean filters Many RV's have a variety of filters that need to be maintained. Now is a good time to <u>clean your AC filters</u> and replace your water filters, etc. If you are feeling energetic, rinse your window screens as well. These screens will act as filters throughout the summer.
- Air vents and windows Make sure all windows and air vents are working correctly. As the weather gets warmer, these vents become even more essential to ensuring proper airflow, preventing high humidity, and keeping you cool.
- Check safety devices Before heading out, make sure all safety devices in your RV are working well. This includes the fire extinguisher, smoke alarm, LP detector, and carbon monoxide detector.
- Update the truck's insurance and registration Finally, make sure the truck's insurance and registration are up to date. Store your camper trailer's documentation in an accessible place in your truck.
