Headquarters Report



WBCCI headquarters reports that our membership is growing! We are at the highest level that we have had in the last 20 years. There were 8954 members at the end of 2021.



Airstream, Inc. Report

Justin Humphreys, VP of Sales for Airstream Inc., reports that the demand for Airstream products are extremely high yet there are several challenges presently being addressed at the factory. Like so many other industries supply chain problems continue. There has been a high level of COVID illnesses or workers on COVID protocol that have been sidelined from work these last few months. This year has shown a high attrition rate of employees and the pool of new employees is smaller than in previous years due to competition from local factories, such as Honda. Airstream does have the benefit of having only a day shift which helps them attract new workers.

On a positive note, Thor Industries, working through Airstream Europe, debuted this week a concept prototype Estream trailer. This innovative all electric trailer propels itself to help boost the tow vehicle's fuel economy and to extend the range of future all-electric tow vehicles. ~

IBT Recommends a Change in the Club Leadership Model



The WBCCI has done a reassessment of its leadership effectiveness as part of its long-range planning process. The turnover of a one-year presidency to a new administration was found to be counterproductive to the club's goals.

In the previous seventy years of our club's existence our four International officers were elected by the membership and rose in rank through the vice president offices to become president for a one-year term. This term concluded at an International Rally. Though this had served the club well in its early years, it has shown to be inadequate in the our present more complex club having more diverse needs, desires and possibilities.

At this year's mid-winter International Board of Trustees (IBT) meeting we concluded to recommend to the club membership a change to the executive leadership model that it be an Executive Council made up primarily of 9 members elected by our membership and the non-elected past president. The Executive Council would have these 10 voting members and, along with the 12 voting Region presidents, comprise the voting component of the IBT. It would then be up to the IBT to choose, from the elected Executive Council members, the best individual to serve as the club's president.

The Executive Council members would be elected for two-year terms. This council would likely be comprised of members that would have special skill sets who would not necessarily have any aspirations to be the club's president. We could also benefit from one exceptional person serving as our president for up to four years. This would provide more continuity than what is currently provided with our annual changing of the guard. This council (board) approach is a time-tested leadership model for most non-profit organizations, corporations and many town governments.

This new Executive Council approach concept will be further discussed in the Blue Beret, local club conversations and meetings. Ultimately it will need the membership to vote in the proper Constitutional changes to make this effective and benefit us all for the next seventy years. ~

On Jan 15, 2022 the Region 1 Nominating Committee identified the following candidates for the Region 1 Presidential positions for the next two years:

Resumes for each of these candidates follow this announcement. COCAC will be voting on this slate at the May Chili Cook-Off Rally meeting.

The COCAC met via zoom in January to discuss concerns related to member privacy concerns and investigate the steps required to allow for online registration and payment for rallies and events. The move to bring these transactions online is an effort to make the process easier for both ourselves and all members nationwide to identify, participate and pay for events. With WBCCI members being more mobile and many more full-timers we are excited to share our event with members from all over the country.

Rich Kushman has implemented the following policy: The address published on the website and in the newsletter for events at members' homes **IS NOT** that of the event / home. It is the generalized address of the area where the event will be held, often a nearby town hall. Actual addresses can be found in the annual directory or by contacting the host. Thank you, Rich for this thoughtful approach toward online privacy.

Glen Lessig has volunteered to serve as "Registration Administrator". He will be implementing online registration for all events starting with the May Chili Cook-Off Rally. He will be able to supply a link to each host that can be used on the flyer and a link to the spreadsheet of registered participants in real time. Currently, we will be using Google forms although we can anticipate a change to JotForms as suggested by WBCCI for this purpose.

Chris Dubrowski has accepted the role of "Event Administrator". The goal for this position is to monitor online payments and make electronic transfers to our event hosts as needed.

Thank you, Sandy Sasuta, Glen Lessig, Chris Dubrowski, and Don Allers who are working collectively on the various components needed to move toward an online registration and payment program for future events.

- What coordination between COCAC Treasurer and the COCAC Event Manager is required.
- Establish an "Events" bank account for COCAC.
- Determine requirements to manage the interface between online payment processing facility (possibly PayPal as suggested by WBCCI) and Events bank account.
- Determine requirements to manage transfers between Events bank account and event hosts.
- Identify a secure, cost effective, and functional registration and compliant online payment processing facility for use by the COCAC.
- Report recommendations at the COCAC business meeting at Chili Cook-Off Rally, May 2022

A brief conversation was started regarding how the club can effectively market COCAC to potential new members.
