MIKE'S MUSINGS



Greetings: Linda and I spent three weeks in Florida on Sanibel Island and one week in Miami. Our daughter lives in Miami. Our son and family came to visit us and we celebrated Christmas.

I have two items on this agenda. First, I want to give some directions for the February luncheon at Perkins, 4045 Hammond Ave., Waterloo on Saturday, February 12, 2022. Most of you will drive into Waterloo on Hwy. 20. You should exit Hwy. 20 at Exit 230. On this off ramp you will be driving toward IA Hwy. 21 or Hawkeye Dr. You will then drive north on Hwy. 21 about one-quarter mile to San Marnan Dr., which is a "T" intersection. You turn right (east) and drive on San Marnan for one-quarter mile. At the light on San Marnan/Hammond, turn right. Then, turn left toward Perkins, which is about a block. Your GPS should work, but sometimes it doesn't take the best route. Reservations start at 11:00, with the meal at 11:30. We have our own party room.

The second item concerns the May 12 rally at Rock Creek State Park. Mike Donahue and Marty Murray-Lubbart, as co-hosts, have given some suggestions. I bring this up now because reservations can be made with the DNR starting at midnight (12:00 AM) on February 11, 2022, which is 90 days before the rally. Another suggestion would be to pay for one, two or three extra camping days in order to beat the rush. For example, reserve for May 11, 2022 - May 15, 2022 on February 10, 2022 and this may give you a better selection.

Here are the suggestions of Mike Donahue:

- Level sites with best view are 33 thru 42 (all back-ins)
- Public access to the dock, sites 36, 37, 40 and 41
- Access to long pier, sites 38 and 39
- Pull thru sites, 49 thru 55 (mostly level)
- 50 amp sites 25, 26, 27 (pull thru), 28, 29, 30 (back in) and 71 thru 75

From the lake to the entrance, it goes uphill and gets worse the further you go. Bring extra boards for leveling.

We hope to see everyone at the luncheon. It should be a good meeting.
