Electric Trucks By: Andi Matsumoto

Browsing the Wall Street Journal the other day, I read one of my favorite columns, The Rumble Seat. Author Dan Neil has the enviable job of test-driving new cars and writing about them. That week he wrote about the new Rivian R1T electric truck and it got me thinking about whether and when we would be ready to trade in our diesel RAM for one of these new toys for towing our Airstream.

The Rivian weighs over 7,000 pounds and has a range of about 280 miles. But if you are towing or it's cold out, that range could be half. It costs \$76,000 and has a tow rating of 11,000 pounds. The torque on an electric vehicle is part of what makes it fun (835 horsepower / 908 lb.-ft). Plus, it looks cool.

Ford has 200,000 reservations for its 2022 Ford F-150 Lightning (\$40,000 to \$90,000). The Ford's range is 240 to 300 miles and can tow up to 10,000 pounds. Tesla has over a million reservations for its Cybertruck, which has a boasted range of 500 miles (\$39,000 to \$69,900), and Rivian is booked out for the next 2 years with 55,000 orders. Chevy is planning a 2023 or 2024 electric Silverado, but orders are not being taken yet. Given these booking numbers, the consumer demand is clearly there. Another possible attraction for some electric trucks is that the Federal government offers \$7,500 federal tax credit and California offers \$5,000.

A huge potential downfall of choosing an electric truck would be the estimates that towing your Airstream might cut your range in half. So, Ford's truck might only get 100 miles range when pulling a trailer. Range anxiety is being addressed by projects to install electric charging stations at 50-mile intervals around the country, so you would never be further than a comparable gas station. But this effort is in its infancy. Perhaps it is wise to wait and see this new technology mature before making the leap.
