
In Memoriam Mary A. Woods

### Getaway to Ithaca, NY

Exploring waterfalls and gorges by Terry Hauschild



As the saying goes, "Ithaca is GORGES!". Ithaca, NY has over 150 waterfalls within 10 miles of downtown Ithaca. With Ithaca only 200 miles away from our home (approx. 4 hour drive), this would make for a perfect weekend getaway. Well, the Nor'easter had something to say about that.

On October 25th, 2021, Wendy and I took off for Ithaca, NY, in our Bambi staying at Robert H Tremen State Park, 5 miles from downtown Ithaca. Robert Tremen State Park was recommended to us by some fellow Airstreamers we met when we were at the

Little Buffalo Apple Fest earlier in October. Having made our reservations earlier in the month with very few sites available (normally 11 electric sites and 60 non-electric sites), it was a bit of a surprise when we checked in to see only a few sites taken. Well on October 26th, the Nor'easter struck the East Coast of the United States which eventually became Tropical Storm Wanda. The powerful storm affected much of the East Coast causing significant flooding with no exception to where we were. We were able to weather the storm over the next day and even visit some local wineries while driving through flooded roads. Unfortunately, for the next day, the gorges were closed due to unsafe conditions along the gorge trails but we could hike along the rim above the gorges.

Over the next several days we were able to witness some of the most fantastic gorges and waterfalls on STEROIDS. We visited the Lower Falls and Lucifer Falls in Tremen State Park, Buttermilk Falls in Buttermilk Falls State Park, Ithaca Falls in downtown Ithaca and Taughannock Falls (215') in Taughannock Falls State Park.

In addition to beautiful gorges and waterfalls, we visited a number of wineries (Goose Watch, Hosmer, Thirsty Owl & Knapp to name a few) along Cayuga Lake and breweries (Liquid State Brewing Company) in downtown Ithaca.

On October 29th we headed back home. Let it be known, Nor'easter or not, we really enjoyed our time there and look forward to going back some day. We do have another 140+ waterfalls to see.


