19 wineries and attracting over 100,000 people a year.

Early parking

Anyone wanting to arrive at the DuQuoin State Fairgrounds for the Region 5 Rally before Sunday, Sept. 12 needs to park at the campground at the north end of the fairgrounds.

You will then be able to move to the Rally camping site on Sunday. Parking at the Rally site prior to Sunday may make you subject to relocation, The Southern Illinois region has been recognized for its distinctive wines by being named an American Viticultural Area, which gives the region a ranking as one of the most respected winemaking areas in the country.

Lunch on the wine tour will be at the unique Giant City Lodge built by the CCC during the 1930s and recognized for its outstanding restaurant.

Bison Bluff Buffalo Farm is home to about 350 head of buffalo, including 75 new calves a year. The farm is

operated by Cliff Howell with an assist from parents, Richard and Frankie Howell, who are members of the Southern Illinois Unit of WBCCI.

The tour starts at the farm itself and then visitors travel by tram down Wing Hill Road past Starview Winery and out to the pasture.

The farm includes about 1,100 acres of pasture that the herd is rotated through. Each section of pasture is used for only three weeks before the herd is moved. Twice a year the entire herd is moved to the farm's paddock to be weighed and tagged.

You get an opportunity to meet buffalo up close and personal on a tram tour of the Bison Bluff Farm south of Carbondale.





Rent One Ball Park in Marion, Ill., is the 3,400 seat home to the minor league baseball team, the Miners.

Between 35 and 50 buffalo are butchered a year and the low fat meat is sold at Southern Illinois grocery stores, restaurants and at the farm.

Lunch for the Bison Bluff tour is also at Giant City Lodge at Giant City State Park.

The Aisin Industrial Park in Marion, Ill. is the location of three of the 25 automotive plants operated by Japanese owned Aisin Seiki Co., one of the largest automotive component manufacturers in the world.

Aisin located its first plant in Marion in 2001 followed by new plants in 2003 and 2004.

The first plant was 164,000 square feet followed by a 165,000 square foot expansion two years later. The plant has

produced sunroofs for Toyotas that are assembled in Erlanger, KY. Aisin Light Metals was the next plant followed by Aisin Electronics.

Marion, a Southern Illinois community of 16,000 along Interstate 57, defied skeptics in 2007 when it built a modern 3,400-seat baseball park for a minor league team.

Dress Code

For Unit presidents at the opening ceremony and for the board meeting the dress code will be white blouse/shirt, dark skirt/ slacks (no shorts or jeans) and black shoes. Blue Beret is optional.

The park is equal to any major league park except for capacity and has been a huge success. The team set a single game record of 6,718 fans, this summer hosted the Frontier League All-Star Game and produced a team with a 39-9 record at the mid-way point of the season. The park has lawn seating for 2,000, two picnic gardens, 14 suites, a banquet facility and McDonald's Fun Zone.

R&R Guide created to help boost Region 5 membership

This will be my final message to you as Region 5 Membership Chairman concerning retention of current members and recruiting new members. It has been both rewarding and challenging.

The initial analysis of reasons our units were losing more current members out of the bottom of the "People Funnel" than were entering through the top of the funnel was inconclusive. We owned the finest camping RV that has ever been manufactured; we had leaders with intelligent minds, motivated and positive attitudes; we had the

whole world that we could caravan through or set up campsites (rallies) and yet we were losing more members than we were gaining year after year. A Region that once boasted 13 units was now down to only seven.

Presto! Perhaps a Retention and Recruiting Program was what was needed. Current Membership Chairpersons were seemingly overloaded and were not receiving the support and guidance of the Unit boards of directors, other unit officers and members in this challenging task. First response - Let's suggest asking units to seek out two other highly motivated unit members to assist that Membership Chair; one to focus on retaining current members in their unit and another one to make a hard charge to obtain new members.

Now we had a plan in hard copy. Ask these three members that assumed those positions to become the "R&R Leadership Team", to spearhead the mission of retaining and recruiting in their units.

The R&R Program was introduced at the Region 5 Rally in Brandenberg KY in 2008. However, with only approximately 20 percent of our Region members present at the rally (only about 15 percent attend International and Unit rallies) the effort was severely minimized in obtaining the results that had been hoped for.

The three Region Units that that took the bull by the horn, so to speak, and focused on unit membership by asking someone to fill the two Unit membership team positions have attained success above previous levels. From July 2008 through June 2009, these three units reflected a net gain in members that pulled them to the top 1st, 2nd, and 3rd positions of the seven units in the Region for that first year. They are to be congratulated. Thanks also go to the other units for maintaining your unit for another year.

I leave this thought with you . If you love the Airstream way of life, the Fun, Adventure and Fellowship of being a member of your WBCCI Unit please, obtain a hard copy of the Region 5 R&R Guide or pull it up on the Region web site, review it and see if you can help your unit have a net gain of members this year. We could be an awesome force in this effort. Good luck.
