Leeper to tornado site

For eight days David Leeper, Region 5 chaplain, served as a chaplain at West Liberty, Kentucky for the Kentucky Southern Baptist Disaster Relief.

West Liberty was devastated by a tornado that struck at 5:54 p.m. March 2, demolishing much of the downtown area and a lot of the residential area.

Two Kentucky Unit WBCCI members are from West Liberty, Bob and Louise Martin and Tommy and Teresa Phipps. They were not injured in the storm and their homes were spared.

Leeper arrived at West Liberty on March 4 and spent eight days there.

"We would start the day with a devotional and end the day with a devotional," Leeper said. "We had between 45 and 80 Disaster Relief workers each day and were preparing between 1,700 and 3,950 meals a day."

Also most days two chain saw crews were working with 6 to 10 men and women on each crew.

Please be in prayer for West Liberty, Leeper urged.
