Constitution issue key one for WBCCI

A revised Constitution and Bylaws for the Wally Byam Caravan Club International has been proposed by the Constitution & Bylaws Revision Committee and will be voted on at the annual delegates meeting in DuQuoin June 30.

The committee was appointed by International President Norm Beu in July 2010 with a charge to revise the WBCCI Constitution and Bylaws. The revision process differs from amending because it includes multiple and significant changes and becomes a new document.

The committee of five members was named with Dona Garner, WBCCI Parliamentarian, as chair. Countless hours were spent over six months developing a consensus on revisions.

The finished documents were turned over to President Beu for dissemination in April and were posted on the WBCCI website which they could be viewed by all members.

Units are encouraged to conduct a review meeting for members to make a determination how its delegate should vote at the

visit to a recreation of the original Eli Lilly office, seeing how medicines were produced in the early days, a view of the head-quarters and a Dutch treat luncheon in the corporate cafeteria.

In 1986 the Challenger Center for Space Education was created to carry on the legacy of the Challenger space shuttle crew who died tragically in an earlier space flight. In the past 25 years the Challenger Centers have grown to 48 throughout the country including one in Brownsburg, Ind. That one will be the destination for a Region 5 tour. The Center offers simulated space missions where participants execute mission directives including rendezvous with a comet, returning to the moon, encountering earth or a voyage to Mars. The Center is cutting edge.

Another Region 5 tour will give you an opportunity to step back in time to 1911 and join school marm Doris Martin at the Pittsboro One Room School #3 for lessons in elocution and ciphering and assume the persona of one of the students who attended the school in 1911. You will use books, maps and slates from 1911 along with modern amenities of the time.

The Hendricks County Museum will be the destination for a tour. The museum was once the county jail, which was connected with the county sheriff's Victorian home. The tour will take you through both and allow you to move from one world to another by passing through the doorway. The building is on the National Register of Historic Places. Included are artifacts from Central Normal College, which was located in Danville. You will also find period furniture and equipment along with American Indian artifacts.

The one-room-school and Challenger tours cost \$5 each. The other two are free. Sign up when registering for the rally.

International delegates meeting in June. The vote could be on accepting or rejecting all the changes in whole; accepted or rejected in sections; modified line by line; or new proposals presented and voted on.

A wealth of information has been produced by the Constitution & Bylaws Revision Committee, approximately 85 pages.

Some club policies and practices are changed significantly and some are primarily editorial in nature.

Some highlights of the changes that are being proposed by the committee are:

- A direct membership vote for International officers and for constitution amendments
- —Greater flexibility for the dates of the International Rally.
- —A streamlined and more democratic system for making amendments to the constitution, which will make it easier for grassroots proposals to be considered.
- A wider use of electronic means for conducting business throughout the club.

Southern Illinois Unit Newsletter Editor Gordon White made an important point in his assessment: "Let's remember Wally Byam formed and organized WBCCI to make it a member led, volunteer
