PLENTIFUL OPPORTUNITIES AT FARMINGTON

Well, fellow WBCCI members, it's time to plan for the trip to the International Rally in Farmington! It's less than two months away! The great news is that the tentative Rally Schedule (June 25 - July 5) is on the WBCCI.org website! Bicycle rides will resume each morning. There will be a morning coffee time and an afternoon happy hour. You'll also find the times for the RV technical seminars, genealogy seminar, crafts and quilting, and many more items too numerous to detail.

A new feature this year will be a Free Day. Yes, Monday, June 29 is unscheduled so that we can make our own tours or whatever else we would like to do. There are many more new items on the schedule as well as some old favorites. For specifics, be sure to check the schedule. You can read it online or download to print.

You can find the Rally Schedule by going to WBCCI.org, selecting Activities on the menu bar, selecting International <u>Rally</u> from the menu that appears, and then selecting <u>2015 Farmington</u>, <u>NM</u> from the menu Farmington that then appears. A page with information about the Rally will show up. When you've finished reading the top half, scroll to the bottom of the page where you will find the Rally Schedule (tentative 4-16-15) as

well as a registration form (if you haven't as yet signed up) and an application for handicapped parking. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE ABOVE UNDERLINED WORDS ARE NOT LINKS, MERELY DIRECTIONS.

In preparation for your trip, check past "Blue Berets" for important information: scheduled tours (February and March issues), places you might like to visit on your Free Day (March), and parking directions (April). Better yet, bring all of them along for reference!

You can come earlier than your scheduled parking date. The nightly camping fee is \$25, payable to the McGee Fairgrounds. You may be parked in a different area and be moved on your scheduled parking date. (info in April "Blue Beret," p. 34, about halfway down the page.)

As of this writing, there is one motion for the Delegates Meeting. Amendment No. 1, proposed by the International Board of Trustees, seeks to clarify the current wording regarding unanimous consent during voting at the Delegates Meeting (Section 5). The recommended change would delete the phrase "unless such vote is to be unanimous" and insert the phrase "except when a request for Unanimous Consent is approved." This clarifies how Delegates can request an alternate voting method other than Roll Call.

In addition to packing "Blue Berets" and your Parking Pass, remember donations for all WBCCI charities—pull tabs, Common Cents for Kids, hats, blankets, stuffed animals, books, pet supplies—entries for the Unit Publications contest and the Hobby Show.

And, consider volunteering for some activity. After all, the International Rally, as all WBCCI rallies and caravans, is put on by a host of volunteers. There's no better way to meet more new friends and be a part of the action. See those past "Blue Berets" for information about volunteering.

As for me, I'm re-reading Tony Hillerman's books as we will be near Navajo country, and planning my quilting projects. I always look forward to traveling west. I hope I'll see you there! Submitted by Carol White

REGION 5 LUNCHEON - The luncheon is scheduled for June 27 at 11:30 AM at Zebadiah's located at 2210 E. 20th Street, Farmington. Members will order from the menu. Units should plan on bringing door prizes.

UNIT DELEGATES - Each Unit must elect a delegate and an alternate to represent the Unit at the Delegates Meeting Tuesday, June 30. Be sure the delegate and alternate have the appropriately signed credentials that were mailed to each Unit by WBCCI headquarters. Delegates and alternates will present their signed documents at the Credentials Desk at registration where they will receive their delegate ribbons. Dress for the Delegates Meeting is dark pants/skirt, white collared shirt/blouse or casual street wear. No shorts, please.

UNIT FLAG BEARER - The Unit flag bearer at the Opening Ceremony at 7:30 PM June 26, should wear dark (black or Navy) slack/ skirt, white collared shirt/blouse and dark shoes. Bring Unit flag and flag poles to opening and closing ceremonies. Flag bearers should attend flag practice June 26 at 3 PM.

UNIT PRESIDENT'S APPRECIATION DINNER - Unit presidents and spouses are invited to the Unit President's Appreciation Dinner June 25 in rooms D and E. Dressy Casual - no shorts, please.

UNIT OFFICERS LEADERSHIP TRAINING - Present and potential officers are encouraged to attend the Unit Officer Leadership Training from 8:30 to 11:30 AM July 1 in room D.

If you have a friend that owns an Airstream and isn't a WBCCI member, bring them along. If you attend any Air Forums rallies, invite them. A WORD FROM BOB



Well, we just returned from our first rally of the season. It was great to get our Airstream de-winterized, tanked up and rolling again. Here in Northern IL we had our season opener at Lee County fairgrounds in Amboy, IL. We had an excellent turnout - 13 trailers and 1 Interstate MH. Dinner was on our own Friday evening but the unit provided breakfast and dinner on Saturday.

It was very exciting to see how our unit has changed in the short time Sandy and I have been members. We have a number of new members who like us, are still working and have limited time to get away. It is clear to me that we need to provide more weekend activities and shorter caravans to allow this new group the opportunity to participate and be active unit members.

We had an interesting discussion during our Saturday afternoon tech time on the use of generators to power up our rigs when the utility power is not available. I have a Honda EU3000 with inverter technology and I have used this unit for the last 5 years with no issues other than my little AC power monitor plugged into one of the duplex outlets in the right always indicates a "PF" condition when using the generator. The "PF" warning in this case indicates an improper grounding situation. My limited understanding of this condition is that this particular generator, and apparently others using inverter technology, do not have an internal bond between the neutral and ground references. As things always continued to work while on the generator, I just ignored this condition. One of our members came up with a clever solution to this situation. He took a standard 110V AC male plug and put a jumper wire between the neutral and ground lugs and sealed the whole thing up with electrical tape. This is plugged into one of the outlets on the generator and "PF" warning was eliminated. Pretty cool and no more warning.

Sandy and I are looking forward to being Region Officers and we hope to get out to all the Region 5 units at some point for a visit. Thanks for letting us serve.

REGION 5 MEMBERSHIP REPORT

GOOD NEWS – ALL UNITS SHOW INCREASED MEMBERSHIP

Every unit in Region 5 has increased its membership when compared to unit voting size at Gillette, Wyoming on June 30, 2014. Region 5 has grown from 223 members (rigs) to 281 members (rigs) at the present time. That is an increase of twenty six percent (26%).

I would like to congratulate all units for their membership increase. The most improvement (30%) came from Indiana, Illinois Lincolnland, Southern Indiana and Southern Illinois. Central Indiana, Kentucky and Northern Illinois accomplished increases in the 20-29% range.

WBCCI offers members the opportunity to help others in their communities on the International, Regional and Unit level.

With the <u>International</u> Rally less than two months away, it is time to be finishing infant/children's blankets and warm hats. It's also time to collect tabs, Cents for Kids, gently used children's books, stuffed animals, pet items, left over yard, etc. Please check previous Blue Berets to be sure I included all needed items!

During the <u>Region 5</u> Rally this coming September in Goshen, IN, WBCCI members will be able to revisit Church Community Service in Elkhart, IN, an agency Region 5 assisted in 2006. 1) Donation of plastic bags,

2) Donation of personal care items, such as soap, shampoo, toothpaste and toothbrushes, toilet paper, etc. for their shelves,

3) Help in packaging soup/dip mixes (something we did in 2006), which the agency sells as a fund raiser. The time for our group to do this is still to be established.

WBCCI placed a monument in the garden 40 years ago. The International Peace Garden is along US 218 at the North Dakota, USA – Manitoba, Canada border. Time took its toll on the original monument. Region 7 was given permission at mid-winter IBT in 2012 through a special committee to raise money for the creation of a new monument to replace the original. Funds raised enabled a sculptor be commissioned to create a new monument. That work has been done. Approximately \$15,000 is needed for the final phase of the creation of the actual monument and its placement in the International Garden. The pictures below show the Garden which straddles the border, the fountain area where the new monument will be placed, and the sculptor's Peace Model.
