Danville, Ind. Fairgrounds location for the Region 5 Rally in 2011

Region 5 President Louise Humble announced at the annual business meeting that the 2011 Region 5 Rally will be held at the Hendricks County Fairgrounds at Danville, Ind. Sept. 14-18. Danville is located 13 miles west of Indianapolis on U.S. Highway 36.

Humble said the Fairgrounds is a rela-

_ tively new facility with Business air conditioned buildings and camp sites with 30 amp electricity, water - and some sewers.

In one action the board nominated past president Bob Moyers to chair the nominating committee responsible for filling two vice president positions.

The board also approved continuing to send the Region 5 newsletter to Members at Large. The Region 5 MAL retention rate is 26 percent compared to a 46 percent rate retention rate for WBCCI as a whole.

First Vice President Barry Bell reported on membership and said the Region is showing significant improvement. The past year it had a net loss of only 13 members. This compares to a loss of 27 in 2009 and 54 in 2008. The Region 5 membership total at the end of fiscal 2010 was 321.

Treasurer Ron Gordy reported the Region had total equity of \$6,498.85 as of Sept. 10, 2010. During the year each of the Region 5 activities had a positive balance...\$320.09 for the 2009 Computerfest, \$16.63 for the 2009 Region 5 Rally at Brandenburg, KY and \$40.83 for the 2010
