General Butler Park 2013 Region Rally location

General Butler State Park, where the 2013 Region 5 Rally will be held, is located 44 miles southeast of Louisville along the Ohio River.

The closest community is Carrolton, population 3,800. The park is southeast of Carrolton on Kentucky Route 227.

General Butler State Park is the sixth oldest park in Kentucky, opened in 1931, on part of the William O. Butler farm.

The campground at General Butler has 111 sites with utility hookups and grills. Showers and restrooms are available at two central service buildings and one laundry facility is available. Wi-Fi connection is also available. An access code can be purchased at the campground booth.

The hilltop Butler Lodge is an attraction at the park. It has 53 rooms.

Adjacent to the lodge is the General Butler Conference Center that has large meeting space and where the Region events will be held.

The hilltop resort is the essence of river town charm and features a spacious lobby with large windows overlooking the Ohio River.

The lodge features a restaurant, Two Rivers, that is highly regarded as a Kentucky dining establishment. It has a fishing decor and is named because of the park's location at the confluence of the Kentucky and Ohio rivers.

The park also has 24 cottages, one, two and three bedroom. Also available is a large enclosed shelter house that can be used for functions.

Other features of the park include a 30 acre lake with excellent fishing (Kentucky Fishing License required), a nine-hole golf course, boating, tennis courts, Ohio River overlook, canoeing, pedal boats. miniature golf and hiking trails.

The Butler family, for which the park is named, is one of

Kentucky's great historic families. General Percivel Butler was a Revolutionary War veteran who settled in Carroll County, Kentucky in 1796. He had four sons, all who became prominent figures in Kentucky history. William Orlando Butler, after whom the park was named, was a soldier and statesman who served as a congressman, was a candidate for Kentucky governor and a candidate for vice president in 1848.

The Butler home on the park grounds was built in 1859 and has been preserved. It is open for tours. The brick federal-style residence has eight rooms, two wide halls, a finished third floor and a full basement, Ninety percent of the furniture is original.

Report on Tipton Rally board meeting Lack of V-Ps casts doubt on Region's future

An overriding concern expressed at the Region 5 Board of Directors meeting at the Tipton, IN Region Rally was the vacancy of the First and Second Vice President chairs.

President Barry Bell said he was concerned about the future of Region 5 with the officer positions still unfilled.

He said the Region is faced with three options.

One, is to get vice president candidates to fill the positions.

Second, is for the Region to be absorbed by other Regions such as Illinois going to Region 8, Indiana going to Region 4 and Kentucky going to Region 6.

Third, is dissolution of the Region with members joining whatever Unit they want to or to leave the club.

President Bell introduced outgoing president Louise Humble as the new chair of the nominating committee. Other members are Lee Moyer and Bob Zufall. This is one of two positions Humble will hold. Bell announced that she will also chair the Membership Committee, a position normally occupied by a vice president.

Bell also announced two other new committee chairs. Larry Wilson is the Caravan Chairman and Patsy Marston is the Blue Beret Contributing Editor. He thanked Nancy Green for her years of outstanding service as Contributing Editor.

Electronics was also center stage at the Region board meeting.

--Central Indiana Unit treasurer Ron Gordy has installed the methodology to make it possible to pay WBCCI and Unit dues by email using Pay Pal. This is a beta test for WBCCI.

--The WBCCI.org web site has been redesigned by the Electronic Communications Committee headed by Damon Beals from the Central Indiana Unit. The site is designed with a focus on prospective members with all the vital information on the home page with links to expanded information.

. Membership was another major issue to go before the board. Chairman Humble said Region 5 had two major goals for 2012. One was to increase overall membership over 2011 and the second was to retain all the new members added in 2011. She said the Region fell 29 short of maintaining its 2011 membership, which was one of the largest percentage losses in WBCCI. She said Northern Illinois and Southern Illinois were the only two Units that retained 100 percent of new members.

Community Service Committee chair Mary Jo Brown, from the Central Indiana Unit, identified Encore Lifestyle and Enrichment Center in Tipton as the agency that would receive donations from the Region 5 Rally.
