Region 5 Rally in Danville attracts 68 Airstreams

Attendance dropped sharply at the 2011 Region 5 Rally at the Hendricks County Fairgrounds with 68 Airstream RVs attending.

This was down from 84 at the 2010 Rally at DuQuoin but the same number as the 2009 rally at Brandenburg, KY.

The Hendricks County Fairgrounds in suburban Indianapolis that Region 5 President Louise Humble selected for the rally was an outstanding facility. Everyone had access to 30 amp electricity, water and sewer.

Most of the activities took place in the ultra-modern Conference Center, where large Hall B had the flexibility for multiple uses.

Illinois Lincolnland had 32.1 percent of its members at the rally, the highest among the seven units. Southern Indiana was second with 29.6 and Central Indiana third with 24 percent.

Seven RVs attended the rally from outside the Region including a contingent from Region 9 led by C.C. Gartman, current president, and First Lady Carla, and

Region 5 business meeting mostly informational

The Region 5 board meeting Saturday at the Region Rally in Danville was primarily informational.

Only one action item came before the board. This was a motion that the Region 5 Report continue to be mailed to Members At Large in the region. The Region 5 Reports have been mailed to MALs for the past three years. The retention rate of MALs has increased every year since the program was launched. In 2010 the retention rate was 70 percent, with 23 of 33 MALs renewing their membership. Before the mailing program the retention rate was 38 percent.

The board approved continuing the program for another year.

First Vice President Barry Bell advised the board of his plans for the region rally in 2012. He has it scheduled for June 12-16 at the Tipton County Fairgrounds in Tipton, Indiana. (Story on page 1).

Treasurer Ron Gordy presented a financial report.

He reported that total the Region's total equity as of Sept. 13, 2011 was \$9,633.15. This compared to \$7,943.35 for 2009 and \$5,780.31 for 2008. He reported that the 2010 Region 5 Rally in DuQuoin finished with a surplus of \$4,332.37 and the 2010 Computerfest had a surplus of \$100.85.

In other reports made to the board:

Membership by Doris Meier, Southern Illinois Unit (She was appointed by President Humble in the Spring, with no Second Vice President who normally does the job): In 2009, Region had 335 units which included 17 new units. In 2010, we had 321 units renew and no new units. In 201, we had 290 units renewed, which included 16 new units. The Region has 7

new members signed up so far this year. She reported that Central Indiana has received an award for renewing all its members in 2009 and 2010.

Caravaning, chairman Barry Bell. He reported a focus on promoting Unit caravans with good results. Six of the seven Units had caravans in 2010-11. They were: Central Indiana Unit conducted the "Heel to Toe Caravan". This was a 10 day, three stop come and or go unit caravan across southern Indiana .; Indiana Unit conducted a unit caravan from their September rally to the Region 5 Rally in Danville, Indiana; Kentucky Unit conducted unit caravans to the Cleveland Rally, the Blue Licks Rally, and the International Rally in Du Quoin, Illinois; Northern Illinois Unit conducted 5 night, 3 stop caravan from the Region 5 Rally in Du Quoin to the Sugarcreek National Rally; Southern Illinois Unit conducted the "Roadside Attraction" unit caravan. This was a 5 night, 3 stop caravan around Springfield, Illinois.

Community Service, co-chairs Carol White and Karen Bell: The agency selected this year was Sheltering Wings, a domestic violence shelter located in Danville. It provides emergency housing for women and children suffering from any form of domestic abuse. The CEO of the agency is Maria Larrison, who spoke to the group at the opening night of the rally. Cash donations received so far is \$163.15. The Sunday morning church service donation will be added to this.

Contributing Editor, Nancy Green chair: Region 5 has had an article in each Blue Beret issue during the past year. A brief description of the Region 5 Computer Rally and the Region 5 Rally was included in the insert in the February Blue Beret.
