

Sign-ups are accomplished by submitting a completed Registration form and payment by the due date to the club Registrar. "Buddy" events allow you to invite a non-member even if they don't own an Airstream. Events lacking hosts or the minimum number of campers may be be cancelled. Rallies are subject to COVID restrictions and protocols.



Silver & Gold in the Emerald Forest

Along the extensive California North Coast lies what is one of the smallest cities in the state: Trinidad. The spectacular coastline and the ten public beaches and ocean rocks make up for the smallness of the town. All this is part of the California Coastal National Monument, of which Trinidad is a Gateway City.

There is plenty to do in the area, from watching the amazing sunsets to walking among some of the tallest, most ancient trees in California. There's fishing, hiking, kayaking, farmers markets and great restaurants.

We will camp at the Emerald Forest RV Park, aka Deer Lodge in the 1930's. The park is situated on twelve acres. Still remaining is the original Celebration Hall which was used as the mess hall for loggers during that time. Some of the existing cabins and buildings date back to that era.

To welcome you on Wednesday, we will have happy hour complete with appetizers of local cheeses served with roasted garlic, grapes, baguette and crackers; and a charcuterie platter with a selection of cured meats & cheeses accented with fresh and dried fruit, olives, nuts, jam, spreads, crackers, and bread. Please bring the drink of your choice.

The buffet dinner will consist of a selection of house breads; spinach and mixed garden salad; rice pilaf (vegan); roasted potato medley (vegan); fresh mushroom lasagna (vegetarian); butternut squash lasagna (vegetarian); and assorted cookies, brownies and lemon bars for dessert. All this fun will be at Celebration Hall.



On Thursday, we will host an exclusive Pacific North Coast event at the private gardens of Howard and Pat Wells (NorCal members): Eight acres of coastal property that are a must see! Decades ago, the Pat and Howard Wells Garden was known as the Sea Knoll Flower Farm. Come spend the day exploring eight acres of woodland, ponds, sea stack rock garden, meadow, orchard, berry and vegetable gardens. We will hunt for "gold nuggets" and prizes will be awarded. For happy hour at the Wells', we will have wine and sparkling juices, paired with various cheeses, chocolates, crackers, fruit and other small bites. (A port-a-potty will be available for everyone's comfort.)

For Saturday's farewell dinner, we will serve appetizers that include a selection of baba ganoush and hummus, with pita bread. Dinner will include a choice of either a gyro platter or a falafel platter, both served with pita bread, rice, fresh cut veggies,Tzatziki and hot sauce.

In addition to the wonderful food, we will have games to keep you engaged and having fun. And of course, there will be great prizes. Remember that you can't win if you don't play!

We will have a group campfire going on every night just outside the Celebration Hall. The hall will be open for members to play games. You can bring whatever s'mores fixings you desire to the nightly group campfire.

- Refund Policy: Cancellations and/or changes to registration must be received no later than Wednesday of the week prior to the rally, in other words, a week before the start of the rally. Refunds will be available depending on funds recovered in all categories. Parking fees are refunded according to RV park cancellation policy.
