We had a great Spring Volunteer Rally this past weekend at Gifford Pinchot State Park. We had 14 total volunteers from the club with 6 trailers. We had a great happy hour on Friday evening, and in airstream rally tradition we had a ton of food. From ham pot pie to burgers & dogs to pasta. Saturday we met the Friends of Pinchot group at the Conewago Day use area and helped plant 6 trees. These varied in type such as Red Oak, White Oak, American Hornbeam & Service Berry. This consisted of digging the hole, placing the tree and refilling the hole, covering with mulch and staking the tress so they remain straight & adding water. Once that was completed, we went to the Boat Mooring #3 and cleared some overgrown brush along the Lakeside Trail and picked up some trash. We also learned what garlic mustard is and that it is an invasive plant, so if we saw this, we pulled it. Some members then hiked other trails and collected trash and pulled garlic mustard and others kayaked the lake.

After cleaning out houses and dealing with auctions for my Mom who passed January 10, 2021, and Bill's brother who passed July 10, 2021, we headed south November 14, 2021. We are going to **Land Yacht Harbor** (LYH), Site 92 in Melbourne, FL. We stayed home last year to take care of my Mom.

bill likes to leave at sun up and drive about 350 miles a day and get a campground before 3 pm. Doing that, it takes us 3 days to get to Florida. We stop and fuel at Flying J's along the way and Bill can get a hot dog, sometimes before 9 am. We like to stop at the states' Welcome Center to get new maps and literature. I always have a map and the book *The Next*

Exit on my lap. I highlight the route as we go too, that way we know where we are in the state.

We like to camp in Brunswick, GA for the final night. Then it is only 230 miles to go. We arrived at Land Yacht Harbor, Tuesday, November 16, 2021, around 11:30 am after a stop at Cracker Barrel. The weather the whole way was dry road and blue skies, (thanks Mom). Now the work begins to back in, unhook and unload our shed and suburban. Many folks stopped and welcomed us back.

We walk the over 300 sites in the morning and evening. Our route takes us past every site. Bill started picking up trash and palm tree droppings. He used a pick stick and bucket. At LYH we have a junk trailer. It is free to put items you no longer want in and free to take out what you might need. Years ago they would throw away old satellite dishes. Bill suggested I paint seasons on them. That started it. This year I was very busy doing special dishes for folks with their names and/or Airstreams. They put them in front of their site so you know who lives there. Bill also cuts out my future painting projects with his scroll saw. He was proud of the double hamburger.

Bill likes anything with wheels so we left LYH and stayed at **Highlands Hammock State Park** for one night. We walked the trails in the old growth hammock trees. We enjoyed the company of another Airstream couple, Mark and Karen Kruer from Indiana. Airstreams seek out Airstreams.

The next morning we headed for **Florida Flywheelers** in Fort Meade, FL where we camped for four days. This **Antique Engine and Tractor Show** featured John Deere this year. They have a village with over 80 cute little houses with their collections, wedding gowns, dolls, ice cream scoops, etc., a snow engine demo, tractor parade, sawmill, Model T assembly, antique cars and over 30 acres of vendors and flea market (my favorite place). We returned to LYH until Sunday, April 3, 2022 then we loaded up and headed

Central PA Airstream Rally at Jersey Shore Haven

August 12-14, 2022



Jersey Shore Haven is located at 728 Dennisville Road, South Seaville, NJ 08246, close to Cape May, NJ

Staying in their open rally field (see map and photos contained in their website www.jerseyshorehaven.org/) at a daily rate of \$40/night/site. These are two-point hookups; 30 amp electric and water (no 50 amp). A sanitary dump is available. We will have access to their screened in pavilion and full kitchen (no dishwasher) to have some meals together, TBD.

Details are still being worked out for the rally. Tentative plans are for a pot luck dinner on Friday night.

We have reserved 10 sites at this time. These will be available on a first come basis thru our club. More may be available if needed.

Our commitment date has been extended to May 15th. We have received five commitments to date. The number of commitments will determine what activities will take place at the rally. Don't wait. Get your commitments in now to Terry Hauschild so plans can be made. No money is due at this time.

RALLY FEES – \$435 for an RV On-Site with 30 amp electric, water, and pump-outs; \$130 for each Adult (18+); \$40 for each Youth 13-17; Free for Children (12 & Under).

ADA ACCESSIBLE PARKING – Special parking, if requested, is near the central rally area for members. We ask that you bring your government/state-issued placard or supporting documentation with you to the rally.

REGISTRATIONS – Through the courtesy of Airstream, Inc., members registered before the start of the rally are entered into a prize drawing. Over \$2,000 in gift certificates for parts and service will be given away. Registrants must be present at the Airstream presentation to win.

STAGING AREA – In an attempt to keep the rigs moving, you will receive a rally arrival date in the Spring of 2022. If you can't make it on that date, the Rally Arrival Team will be ready to park you when you arrive from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. Arrivals after 8:00 pm may stay overnight in the Staging Area, with no hookups, until parking begins the next morning.

CANCELLATION POLICY – Refund requests received by May 28th, 2022, will be assessed a \$50.00 fee. Refund requests after May 29th, 2022, will be assessed a 50% fee. NO refunds after July 9th, 2022. *If you might have to cancel after that day, please consider obtaining travel insurance.*

RALLY PARKING DATES – General parking is tentatively scheduled to begin around July 20th. Parking dates will be sent via email in Spring 2022. Caravans of 5 or more need to contact HQ at <u>rally@airstreamclub.org</u> for arrival date.
