They are hoping that this addition will improve continuity by allowing members to sit in this shorter term capacity rather than have to commit to a six year term (ie: third Vice President through to President).

d) As the 1st Vice President Position is currently vacant, Darlene Caldwell agreed to sit in the position temporarily. Thanks Darlene!

e) As crazy as this sounds we were advised by Airstream International that our liability insurance will not cover us should we require that all participants in our caravans or events be vaccinated. As a result, our Region has sent a letter off to head office to reconsider this directive allowing a rally or caravan leader to have the authority to request covid vaccination as they see fit.

At any rate that is about it for now. Chris and I wanted to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays and please try to stay safe and dry out there!



Fraser Valley Flood Report & Evacuation by Airstream

Be careful what you wish for! We were somewhat chagrined that we had only been able to go camping once during this summer of 2021! Yes, Hedley weekend happened for many of us but we certainly sweltered it out under, what they're now calling, a Heat Dome! Camping at Historic Hat Creek Ranch in July: Cancelled due to forest fires a plenty throughout interior British Columbia. Our AGM in August: Also cancelled due to forest fires! Fortunately for some of you, you got to enjoy golfing and camping at Princeton and Twin Lakes in September. Scheduling conflicts prevented us from joining that fun outing. SO, come October, what else can one do but WINTERIZE having only used our Airstream one time which we did with a little help from our fearless leader John Millard who taught us how to use an air compressor as a substitute to using RV antifreeze. Thank you John.

For us, effects of the historic and devastating flooding of the Sumas Prairie in the Fraser Valley were pretty much over and done with in about 7 to 10 days. No loss of property. Not even any flooding of our several buildings here on our 4 acre farm. Yes, our pastures looked like a lake at one point but that was all. And yes, we sandbagged most entrances to our buildings but even that precaution was not needed, at least not so far, because at the time of writing this, significant rainfall is still in the forecast. The primary impact on our household was the inconvenience of being ordered to evacuate as of mid-day Tuesday November 16th. Abbotsford dairy farmers, hardest affected by the floods, had only been evacuated earlier that same day. Too late, for most of them.

So began our second "camping" trip of 2021! We took about 3-4 hours to throw things into the Airstream. Some on the Sumas Prairie literally had only 30 minutes or less to grab their children before flooding overtook their very homes. Some farm houses saw 10 feet of water inside! Looking back, how blessed we were.

So a-camping we did go ... over to my brother's place on the east side of Chilliwack. Yes, that is the same brother who advertises his 3 RV sites in our monthly newsletter! So that was convenient. Power. Water hookups. Sewer, if we had needed it. He even came over to give us a hand as we prepared to evacuate. Thank you Stuart.

- Now here is a quick run-down of a few, of many, highlights. Arlene, our masterful Editor in Chief, asked me to include a few salient items. We were thankful for so many things, starting with our 25 foot Airstream International. It was perfect for we two adults plus two big dogs, one of which had only enjoyed barn accommodations heretofore!
 - Thankful doesn't begin to describe our feelings over not having had any flood waters affect our property but each of the first 3-4 days (we were gone 7 days in total) the news about that was tentative. The flood waters were such that they could have easily overtaken our property. They didn't. But neither did we experience any disruption of power or cellular phone services. After the 4th day we came home each day to a warm, inviting house where we could shower, get phone messages, and assess the flood situation which was one long block from our place. That is when we did the sandbagging.
 - Communication, we quickly realized, was of vital importance and meaning to us. Eileen gathered probably the most relevant and helpful information on a local Yarrow Facebook Community Watch site. That was wonderful especially in the absence of little to no relevant information coming from governmental sources. For me, it was meaningful to be able to send emails to family and friends, and especially to our Airstream friends. Thank you for your tolerance. But that is a lesson I want to always hang on to. Allowing folks impacted during times of trauma to express their thoughts and experiences, I learned, is of vital importance. So thank you all for indulging me when I kept sending those long missives(emails) on my cell phone!!!
 - And finally, being a person of faith, I realized how blessed we were with something more concrete than property or even life itself to see us through challenging times. Eternal life because of Christ is truly something worth hanging on to.
 - And oh yes, a word to readers in Jackson Center who I understand read our Newsletters. Overall, we grow in admiration and appreciation for our Airstream. Just a couple of recommendations for your consideration. (i) We forgot to take our satchel containing all our Airstream manuals. As a result, we could not quickly and easily figure out how to set the furnace properly so that it kicked out heat instead of cold air, which we didn't need when the temperatures outside were hovering around 40 degrees Fahrenheit. A quick and easy reference would have helped us avoid that first chilling night! (ii) We never did turn on the hot water heater. "Why?" you ask. Because to do so is so very cumbersome. We cannot physically twist the little knobby under Eileen's twin bed through that tiny port hole. So we've learned to totally unscrew the bed platform under her mattress so that we can access the little knobby! The thought of doing all that, even though we remembered to bring a drill, was too over whelming at such a time as that.

So thank you one and all if you've made it this far. Thank you for your notes of encouragement and survival tips! I guess that's why we enjoy and appreciate our fellow Airstreamers. They/You are always ready to encourage and help in a pinch. Thanks so much. Bev







"OOPS – not a Good Idea

Monday, November 15, at 6:45 a.m. we got a text from our friends where our Airstream is stored. "our place is getting flooded – we may have issues with Airstream and Motor Homes – not sure we can do anything – we're trying to pump out water". I called a little later wondering if I should go move the trailer only to learn the water was so deep I wouldn't be able to get in. So begins the saga of our encounter with the November 14, and on, terrible flooding in BC. We got it out of that spot by early Wednesday when the water had gone down a little. The water had been just up to the level of the floors inside.

Damage – sure, but so much better than it could have been. Carpets and underlays are out and interior is drying as we speak. Insurance adjuster was there Friday and is submitting our claim to insurance company (don't know yet if it will be covered). Everything, so far, works. Going to replace converter and brakes, and such due to their immersion. Awful to see our baby like this, BUT, so many have faced so much worse. Can't wait to get her on the road again.



So much devastation and heartache ...so many families are without homes. BC is also experiencing shortages of eggs, milk and other supplies that are sourced from this now wasteland. The rain has also caused wash-outs in our highway system for goods unable to be trucked in.
