### Where you are going:

Search in your GPS for **Angels Camp RV Resort**. The address and phone number are above if needed.

### When you arrive (check-in time is 1pm and check-out time is 11am):

Stop at the stop sign in front of the office. Check-in at the office if open. If closed, look for your registration packet outside the office door. There is usually an after-hours employee on a golf cart that will greet you soon. If there is no registration and/or the golf cart doesn't find you, then call Jason at 330-317-8026.

4. Wood fires might be permitted depending on local regulations and conditions. Bring your propane pits, too.

  - Your host's favorite in the area! No frills, just good wine.
- Twisted Oak
  - Eclectic winery with unique named wines and an odd gift shop.
- Ironstone
  - Beautiful flowers and a gold rush museum.
  - Wines are OK and inexpensive.
  - There is a restaurant on site that is hit or miss for quality and service.

### **Things to see:**

- Town of Angels Camp
  - Shopping
  - Restaurants
  - Stories in Stones (rock shop) CLOSED SATURDAY
  - Cascabel Mexican Restaurant
  - Parking on side streets is usually available. There is a small lot on Slate Circle.
- Town of Murphys
  - Get there early for parking.
    - Street parking is one option. Off-Main is more likely.
    - There is a large public parking lot off of S. Algiers St. near the Murphys Creek Theatre. This fills quickly.
    - The Masonic Center on Surrey Ln.
    - The "Old School House" / Murphys Preschool at 65 Jones St. This is at the far end of Main St. and a little walk to town, but parking is almost always available.
  - Wineries / tasting rooms
  - Saloons
  - Shopping
  - Restaurants (check Yelp or Google Maps reviews)
- Red Apple Pie Barn (4950 CA-4, Murphys, CA 95247). Fresh donuts and pies. Open 9am-6pm. When they are sold out, then they are sold out. Long lines in the mornings on the weekends. Well worth the trip.
- Calaveras Big Trees State Park (25 miles one way from RV park)
- Glory Hole Recreation Area. The entrance is just across CA-49 from the RV park. A bit of a drive down. Hiking, fishing, wakeboarding, waterskiing, boating, sailing, and road and mountain biking.
