This is our first Airstream, but not our first trailer. About 5 years ago, we bought a teardrop and the first time we took it to a campground, we could

He and his wife had an Airstream and they invited us in for a tour. We were amazed and it was love at first site. We loved the teardrop for a few years, then upgraded to a small trailer with slides (Lance 1575), but we had our sights set on an Airstream. The stars aligned for us and we purchased our 2022 25 FBQ International last month from a dealer in Huntsville, AL. We were super nervous driving home over the next few days and spent a night at Catherine's Landing in Hot Springs, AR which was very nice and now on our list for a proper visit. So, we've only used it a few times—and only one real camping trip so far to Fredericksburg.

We chose the 25 FBQ because it's the perfect size for us and the dogs. We love the windows (of course), the striped awnings and the functionality and build quality are beyond compare to almost anything else out there. Our trash can is huge!

So far there are two things we've noticed that could be improved. First is the speakers don't work with the TVs or DVD player. This seems to be an issue with the newer models and the stereo the factory used. The second is the sliding doors on cabinets over the galley only allow access to one side of the cabinet at a time, which can be a pain when cooking. If we had the choice, we would keep the lighted, sliding doors over the bed and dinette, but replace the kitchen cabinet with fold-open doors. Other than those small items, we're pretty much in love.

Other than the Fredericksburg trip, we don't really have memorable trips in this guy yet, but we do have several lined up for the upcoming months, mostly to state parks. Our bucket list for this Airstream would be Santa Fe (hopefully this November), the Pacific Northwest, and maybe Alaska someday.

We have confirmed a booking for the June rally at Big Chief in Burnett. So far, that is the soonest we would be able to make it to a rally. Hopefully we will make it to some fall rallies also. We are looking forward to meeting everyone.

We've done all of this with a 20 lb dog named Rosie who travels surprisingly well.

We selected an AS due to reputation and resell value (in case we discovered we did not enjoy camping) and thankfully have had a great time.



This is our first RV / trailer and we had never camped before. We got a 27FC and like the layout with two twin beds in the front, the Texas Special dual heat pumps and split shower from toilet/lav closet. Even though the trailer is a bumper pull, the aerodynamics mean I can pull the trailer with minimal issues for acceleration, braking and cross winds; the trailer just works extremely well!

We enjoy the overall layout of the trailer interior and towing / braking performance and the windows/crossflow ventilation make many moderate conditions downright comfortable without having to run the heat pumps. Improvements? I have a short list, but as you can probably guess from my earlier paragraph, we've got a 2021 27FC that has some serious factory warranty defects including a jammed front hatch, warped front axle and separating floor / bulkhead seam, so I think my list of improvements could be distilled into "Quality Assurance Quality Control".

Our memorable trips have to be out to The Badlands that took us through the best state parks in TX, AR and then CO. We did the Million Dollar Highway into Ouray via a great state park in north NM, and we've even camped in a friend's yard in the dead center of Richmond, VA. Our bucket list is a big Alaska Trip and I want to spend some time down in the Big Bend.

Thanks for the note and we are looking forward to meeting everyone. Unfortunately, our AS is back to the dealership for a second round of 1 year warranty items. They kept it 3 months the first time and delayed the major repairs until this time - we're hoping it gets turned around by JUL. Hope to be back out on the road this summer!
