Looking for a Camping Destination?

Knowing that many folks have had their travel plans altered or cancelled considering the Covid Pandemic, we ask members to suggest destinations that they have enjoyed and are within a reasonable travel time.

Here are some suggestions. Thank you to everyone who responded to my call for this information.

Tom Fry suggested the <u>KOA Kampground in</u> <u>Dayton, Ohio</u>. Let me add that I had the opportunity to visit the US Force Museum at Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton this week and thoroughly enjoyed my visit. The town of Yellow Springs, Ohio is southeast of Dayton and is known for its shops and restaurants and friendly, diverse vibe.

One of Patsy Marston's favorites is the Ceraland <u>Campground</u> near Columbus, Indiana. Patsy also suggested <u>General</u> <u>Butler State Park</u> near Carrollton, Kentucky. At General Butler you can visit the restored the Butler-Turpin Historic home built in 1859. The house is a brick federal-style residence.

Damon and Erin Beals have done a trip through western Michigan. They suggested South Haven, Saugatuck and Traverse City. In South Haven they stayed at the Kal-Haven RV Park and in Traverse City they stayed at the Wild Cherry Resort. South Haven also has a Yogi Bear Campground and Traverse City is also home to the Holiday Park Campground which is a former Airstream Park. We have been to Traverse City and enjoyed in very much. Saugatuck is on our bucket list; We are sure we would enjoy Saugatuck's diverse, artsy, chilled out vibe. They found places very dog friendly. Damon and Erin are heading to Gatlinburg soon and will be reporting back to us in a future Ticker. Damon's last visit to Gatlinburg was as a kid on a family trip.

Ken and Sandy Langell suggested the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, Kentucky. While there, drive west through Kentucky's beautiful horse country to Pleasant Hill, a restored Shaker community. Make lunch or dinner reservations, take a ride on their riverboat, tour the buildings. Just beyond Pleasant Hill is Harrodsburg, with a reconstructed fort and many historic sites and interesting shops. It is one of their favorite getaways.

From Phil and Mardelle St. John: The Rising Star Casino in Rising Sun, Indiana offers a "state of the art" RV park. They raised the rates a little this year, but they think it is still a good value. Last year it included a continental breakfast at the casino. Rising Sun is a lovely town on the Ohio River. Park vour Airstream and take the free ferry across to Rabbit Hash General Store on the Kentucky side. Play golf at the beautiful Rising Star Casino Golf Course or for a special value and interesting golf experience go to nearby Dearborn Country Club. That may be the steepest hill course we have ever played. Also take some rides down beautiful country roads. Another place is Gibson City Park at Gibson City, IL. This little city park offers water, electric, and a dump station for just \$10.00 per night. You can walk to a grocery store, McDonalds, or a good restaurant. Gibson City is a small county seat town in the heart of farm country. Be sure to eat downtown at the German restaurant. There is a "Links" golf course on the north side of town.

Karen Bell suggested the <u>White River</u> <u>Campground in Cicero, Indiana</u>. There was a club event there years ago and people enjoyed themselves.

What about Joe and Julie Ashland? We enjoyed <u>New Harmony, Indiana</u>. For a quick and nearby weekend escape, we like <u>Prophetstown State Park</u>. Our most recent trip took us to the Cleveland Ohio area where we camped at <u>Punderson State Park</u> and at the <u>KOA Kampground in Streetsboro</u> <u>Ohio</u>. Did you know that the far northeast corner of Ohio was the "Connecticut Western Reserve" prior to the Revolutionary War? RALLY FEES – \$265 for an RV On-Site with 30 amp electric, water, and pump-outs; \$125 for each Adult (18+); \$40 for each Youth 13-17; Free for Children (12 & Under).

ADA ACCESSIBLE PARKING – Special parking, if requested, is near the central rally area for members. We ask that you provide your government/state-issued placard or supporting documentation during registration.

REGISTRATIONS – Through the courtesy of Airstream, Inc., members registered before the start of the Rally are entered into a prize drawing. Gift certificates for parts and service will be drawn with a total of \$2,000 in prizes to be given away. Registrants must be present at the Airstream presentation to win.

STAGING AREA – In an attempt to keep the rigs moving, you will receive a rally arrival date in the Spring of 2021. If you cannot make it on that date, the Rally Arrival Team will be ready to park you when you arrive from 8:00 am to dusk. Arrivals after dusk may stay overnight in the Staging Area, with no hookups, until parking begins the next morning.

CANCELLATION POLICY – Refund requests received by May 22, 2021, will be assessed a \$50.00 fee. Refund requests after May 23, 2021, will be assessed a 50% fee. NO refunds after July 3, 2021. If you might have to cancel after that day, please consider obtaining travel insurance.

RALLY PARKING DATES – General parking is tentatively scheduled to begin around July 14th. Parking dates will be sent via email in Spring 2021. Caravans of 5 or more need to contact HQ at rally@airstreamclub.org for available arrival dates.
