INDIANA BEACH TO BE SITE OF GRANDKIDS/BUDDY RALLY AUGUST 6-9 , 2009

Central Indiana Unit's next rally will be a first time event at the famous Indiana Beach Amusement Park and Campgrounds near Monticello, Indiana. Although this is the "Grandkids/Buddy Rally", don't stay away because you don't have a grandkid or any child to bring or if your buddies all don't camp or are busy that week-end. We will have a fun time for everyone, adults and children.—But isn't it always a treat to have the youngsters around for a few days.

We will be making memories for these kids to last them a lifetime. It might even inspire them to have an Airstream of their own some day. On a serious note, reservations for this rally will be handled a little differently. You need to make your reservations <u>directly with Indiana Beach Campground by calling **1-800-583-5306 and asking for Cathy.** Tell them you are with the Airstream group. We have **20 sites reserved** that are all close together. We will be getting a 10% discount and the cost will be—full hook-ups, \$35.64, and water/electric hook-up \$33.66, per night, including tax. Reservations need to be made early, because this weekend is usually a "sell out". The Bells have planned many fun and interesting activities. Everyone attending will have a good time, whether or not you have a grandchild with you.</u>

Your reservations need to be made by **JULY 16 at the latest.** After that date, sites not reserved will be released. So get your reservation in soon. Remember like it says in the Indiana Beach TV commercial:

"There's more than corn in Indiana!"

From the reports I have received, everyone enjoyed the Crossroads of America Rally. We had 15 Airstream RVs at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, as well as several visitors.

Our next Unit Rally will be at Indiana Beach. We will be staying at the Indiana Beach Campground with shuttle service to the boardwalk. It is only a three block walk to the beach. Activities are being planned for kids of all ages. Friday will be reserved for "rides". They have 6 different roller coasters, including the newest "Steel Hawg". It is Indiana's first custom steel coaster and stands nearly 10 stories tall, featuring multiple heartline spins and inversions as well as a 111 degree first drop-the steepest in the United States!

A few of the "Kiddieland" rides include the "Wabash Cannon Ball Express" for the whole family, Red Baron Biplanes, Kiddy Autos, Boats, Kiddy Whips, Winky the Whale, Convoy Racer, and Kiddy Fire Trucks. Some of the other attractions for the whole family is a walkthrough Dr. Frankenstein's Haunted Castle, a Giant Gondola Wheel, Rocky's Rapids, Dodg-em cars, Paratrooper, Skyride, Water Swing, Tilt-a-Whirl, as well as the Shafer Queen, a paddle wheel driven vessel offering sightseeing excursions on beautiful Lake Shafer. Don't forget your swimsuit! Ideal Beach Waterpark features 6 water slides, "Action River", "Splash Bash" as well as a sand beach swimming area.

Since admission to the park is free, on Saturday you can sit back and watch some of the top talented water sports professionals perform and tear up the waters of Lake Shafer. The dive show features a flaming high-dive and amazing performances by the Pirate Dive Team. The Extreme Ski Show features gravity-defying acrobatics aboard the Air-Chair! This non-stop thrilling show also features impressive stunts and high-energy fire tricks. The Classic Indiana Beach Ski Show is a tradi-

tional ski show that rekindles the past.

From I-65 North, Exit 17B, toward West Lafayette/Brookston.

Merge onto IN-43 toward Brookston. (17.4 mi)

Turn Right onto East 2nd Street/US-24/US-421. Continue to follow Us-24/US421. (5.4 mi)

Turn Left onto South 6th Street. (1.5 mi)

South 6th Street becomes North West Shafter Drive (1.8 mi)

Turn right onto Each Indiana Beach road. (0.4)

End at 5224 East Indiana beach Road, Monticello, IN 47960.

SPRING GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MAY 29, 2009 OF CENTRAL INDIANA UNIT 041 Crossroads of America Rally, Indiana State Fairgrounds

The Spring General Business Meeting of the Central Indiana Unit of Wally Byam Caravan Club International was called to order by President Barry Bell at 8:00 P.M. with the Pledge of Allegiance led by our Region 5 First Vice President, Louise Humble.

Those attending were: Theresa and Greg Sherley, Pat and Tom Anson, Ann Newman, MaryJo and Mike Brown, Mike Zimmermann, Carolyn Beardshear, Darlene and Ron Gordy, Jackie and Russell Thackery, Howard Branscomb, Janet and Ray Brunk, Louise and Jerry Humble, Patsy Marston, Ida Mae and Bud Hershberger, Martha and Dan Kachele, Darlene and John Himmelheber, Donna and Max Carmichael, and Karen and Barry Bell.

The attached Treasurer's Report was read by Ron Gordy. He stated his books were closed on May 27, 2009, therefore the income and expenses of this Rally are not included. The report shows a total equity of \$5,367.74. He transferred \$1,000 from the savings account to the checking account to cover necessary expenses. CIU subsidized the cost of the Spring Luncheon in the amount of \$263.45. This was the difference in the amount received from the attendees and the actual amount charged by Valle Vista for the meal. Ron also reported that we have a total of 48 regular members, 8 affiliate members and 12 subscribers. Dues for 2010 will soon be due. Since there were no questions, the report will be filed for audit.

Karen Bell read the minutes of the Fall General Business Meeting held on Oct. 4, 2008 in Palestine, Illinois. The report was approved as read.

Unfinished Business - None

New Business

Barry Bell presented to the club the slate of candidates running for International offices. The only contested race in the election is for the Nominating Committee, with three candidates running for two positions. Two candidates were nominated by the present Nominating Committee. The third candidate is running from the floor. It was moved by Ray Brunk and seconded by Patsy Marston that the club accept the recommendations of the Nominating Committee. After discussion, the voting was 11 ½ votes "For", 3 votes "No" and ½ vote "Abstained". It was moved and seconded that our Unit vote be by percentage at International. The vote was 8 "For", 5 "Against" with 2 Abstentions. The motion carried.

***President's Note**: The Beals had a family medical emergency and were unable to attend this meeting. Upon their return to the campground and being told the results of the voting, they requested to have their one vote cast with the "no" vote, which would make it 4 notes "no". The club has 48 votes. Voting by percentage, McKelvay would receive 23 votes, Bernd would receive 17 votes, Garvey would receive 6 votes, with 2 Abstentions. This vote totals 48.

There are two Constitutional amendments proposed by the International Board of Trustees. Amendment No. 1 pertains to the Vision and Mission Statement for WBCCI. Amendment No. 2 would allow an Affiliate Member of a Unit, who is a member of a Unit in the same Region, to serve as a Unit's representation at the Delegate's meeting at the International Rally. However no Delegate may represent more than one Unit at the Delegates Meeting. Ray Brunk made a motion that our Delegate have the flexability to vote in the manner he feels is in the best interest of the Central Indiana Unit. It was seconded by Ron Gordy and passed unanimously by our Unit.

Ray Brunk asked for guidance from CIU regarding the brat's cookout he has provided at International in the past. He asked if we wanted him to continue to do this and exactly who should be invited to this cookout. After discussion, a motion was made by Ida Mae Hershberger and seconded by Janet Brunk that only members and affiliate members of the Central Indiana Unit should be invited. The motion passed.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
