Under cloudless skies and brilliant fall colors, the Central Indiana Unit's ten day caravan convened on Friday evening, October 1, and spent three nights in Madison, the "heel" of Indiana's "boot" on the Ohio River.

Monday we moved to Patoka lake, and then packed up Thursday for the final three nights in the "toe" of historic New Harmony, Indiana. The **Fun** part was a wide variety of activities: wandering Indiana's largest 130 block historic district in Madison, a pontoon boat ride on Patoka Lake, touring the Toyota Factory, taking in New Harmony's architecturally award-winning Visitors Center overlooking the early 1800 Harmonist Village, and hiking in cypress swamps as far north as the confluence of the Wabash and Ohio rivers. **Fellowship** grew from getting to know our members who were not able to work in a full ten-day caravan. **Adventure** certainly was not lacking, but fortunately no unplanned "adventures" of the darker kind to catch us off guard.

Our youngest members with their newly restored and polished (read:gorgeous!) 1963 Trade Wind caught up with us on the final weekend for their first CIU camping experience. Members from three different units joined the group and friends from previous caravans stopped by to touch base and make new friends. The further we traveled the more the circle of friends expanded.

This being our first "come and go" caravan we learned a lot about how to make our events as accessible to ALL our members, not just retirees with unlimited time. If you are coming from US 31 at Westfield, IN turn East on IN 32 (3 miles) Turn LEFT onto Little Chicago RD (3.5 mi) Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto CARRIGAN RD/ 211th Street. (1.2 mi) Turn RIGHT onto N. Harbour Dr. (0.2 mi) Turn LEFT onto LONGFORD WAY (0.2 mi. End at 333 Regents Park Lane

If you are coming from IN 37 (North of Noblesville) go WEST on 206th St. Turn RIGHT onto HAGUE RD (0.3 mi.) Turn ono CARRIGAN RD (1.0 mi) Turn LEFT onto LONGFORD WAY (0.1 mi) Turn RIGHT onto REGENTS PARK LANE (0.2 mi.) End at 333 Regents Park Lane

OR set your "GARMIN" or Tom-TOM- to 333 Regents Park Lane, Noblesville, IN 46062
