# "Heel-to-Toe Caravan" Ready to Roll October 1 through October 9



State Parks require names and payment when reserving so it is your responsibility to make your own reservations. Be sure to say that you are with the Airstream Caravan.

Because of the logistics involved in planning a "drop in-drop out" caravan we will not have a kitty fee. Instead the rally fee will \$5.00 per person, for each 3-day segment. Since the Madison segment is at a fairgrounds, not a state park, you don't need a reservation, just let Mike and Carol know that you'll be there.


# Letter from the President
