Banks of the Wabash Caravan Part 2 Oct. 4-13, 2013

Please join us for the 2013 CIU "come and go" caravan as we visit towns along the banks of the Wabash River from Lafayette to Vincennes. You can join and leave the caravan as your schedule permits. There will be a separate "rally fee" for each three day stop, which will be collected on the last day when all costs are known. We have planned many activities for the group and many more alternative things for you to see and enjoy on your own.

Stop 1 - West Lafayette
Ross Camp, 9225 W. 75, W. Lafayette, IN
3 nights Friday Oct. 4 - Sunday Oct. 6



The highlight of the first stop is a visit to Fort Ouiatenen in Lafayette and the Feast of

the Hunter's Moon - a re-creation of the annual fall gathering of the French and Native Americans at this fur trading outpost in the mid-1700's. There will also be a tour of Samara, a Frank Lloyd Wright designed home in West Lafayette, which is still lived in by the original owner.

Stop 2 - Parke County
Parke County Fairgrounds, 1472 North U.S. Highway 41, Rockville, IN
3 nights Monday Oct. 7 - Wednesday Oct. 9



We'll visit the covered bridges in Parke County before the Covered Bridge festival officially opens, missing the crowds and traffic but still getting to see the bridges, tour mills, and enjoy beautiful fall scenery. Along the way, we will also tour the Ernie Pyle World War II Museum in Dana and have a wagon tour of the Wabash & Erie Canal sites in Montezuma.

Stop 3 - Vincennes
Ouabache Trails Campground
3500 N. Lower Ft. Knox Rd., Vincennes, IN
3 nights Thursday Oct. 10 - Saturday
Oct. 12

Lots of historical sites to visit!
Vincennes is the first city in Indiana (1732) and served as the capital of the Indiana Territory (1800–1813). We will take tours of the George Rogers Clark Memorial, the Old Cathedral, the Red Skelton Museum, Grouseland (William



Henry Harrison's mansion), and the Vincennes State Historic Sites.

Prophetstown State Park

Last October, the final stop on the Wabash Caravan Part 1, was Prophetstown State Park. While we were there Ken and I enjoyed visiting the 1920s era working farm, did some geocaching, and visited the nearby Battleground Memorial. We recently returned for a weekend with some tent-camping friends. We were pleasantly surprised to learn Prophetstown has a brand new water park! It just opened in July, and it is a refreshing spot to spend a hot afternoon.



Park admission for Indiana residents is just \$6 per vehicle, and admission to the water park is \$3. There are two challenging slides - with tubes or without - Ken and our grandson Dean loved both of them. My favorite feature was the lazy river, where we floated along on giant tubes, dodging the occasional spray. Our 15 month old friend and his parents were enchanted by the play area with its easy-to-navigate walk-in pool. There is a snack bar, lots of grassy lawn for blankets, and plenty of lounge chairs with huge umbrellas for shade.

The campground is very nice, with sites with full hookups as well as less expensive electric only sites. Some are quite private and surrounded by pine trees, others are on the edge of the restored prairie or surround the large lawn in the center of the campground - a great choice if you are camping with children or dogs. The sites are roomy and level with gravel pads.

On Saturday night we celebrated National S'more Day with a party at the shelter house. Ever tried roasted coconut marshmallow s'mores? We took our instruments and had the kids singing songs with us. Lizzy, a cute little blonde with no front teeth, volunteered to lead a rousing version of "The Eensy Weensy Spider"!

This is Indiana's newest state park, and long-term plans include a lodge and family cabins. There is fishing, hiking, paved bicycle trails - I have heard there are even river otters. This is a great park to keep in mind as you plan next summer's outings. After two visits, there are still features of the park we have not explored, and we look forward to many more weekends at Prophetstown.

We are now getting ready for Part 2 of the Wabash Caravan, and we can't wait! Ann has a lot of great activities planned - if you haven't signed up yet, get in touch with her right away, it is too good to miss.
