Proposed Amendments to WBCCI Constitution

2 amendments to the International constitution have been proposed and will be voted upon at the International rally. Headquarters has compiled the following information on the Constitutional Amendments #1 and #2. Each item has been thoroughly researched and verified through factual operating evidence to help members gain a complete understanding of the proposed amendments and their impact.

These amendments have been passed by the International Board of Trustees (IBT) to membership for an allmember vote to be brought by local club delegates to the IBT meeting on July 27, 2022.

Later this month we'll send an email to our Keystone WBCCI members asking for your vote on each amendment.

- Decouples Club business from the International Rally
- o Allows for a shorter timeline to process a Constitutional Amendment

WHY IS THE CHANGE BEING PROPOSED?

- The current structure is antiquated and flawed to meet the needs of the growing membership and business of the Club today.
- o Allows members the opportunity to serve on the Council who want to give to the Club but are not necessarily interested in becoming President and/or unable to make a 5-year commitment.
- The new term would require two years of service. Current Executive Committee members' total commitment is five years.
- Allows Council members to perform and complete goals after the first-year learning curve by continuing on a second year.
- Easier to recruit for a short-term commitment.
- Provides voting choices to general membership during the election for Executive Council Members rather than offering up a single choice for Officers, as we do now.

Training for Council members on collaborative team building is needed in today's business
The current process no longer meets the needs of our growing Club, as it is more complex than in past years.

• Invites more input from our membership on our leadership by requiring ALL Council members to be elected by the general membership every two years (with exception to the Past International President) vs. the current automatic incumbent succession.

• Lessens the disruption of good service to our Club by allowing Council members to serve more than one term IF the membership votes them in.

• Eliminates the expectation for Committee members to ascend to the Presidency.

• Two-year terms would allow for better long-range strategic planning for the Club

• Utilizes the expertise of Region Presidents to represent the best interests of their members along with personal knowledge of their fellow IBT members when voting for Officers

• Enlists a larger team to provide a more diverse set of skills and knowledge that our leaders are not currently required to have.

• Provides an up-to-date structure to conduct long term strategic business operations instead of starting on a new goal each year.

- o Member participation in Club business without a long-term commitment
- Add additional talent to expand and assist standing committee, International Club needs and local clubs with programs such as:
 - Preserve and promote Wally Byam and the Airstream Club
 - o Caravans

 - o Communication
 - Technology support
 - o Marketing
 - Financial skills
 - Event coordination
 - \circ $\,$ New member campaigns and member retention $\,$
 - Membership benefits
 - Outreach to help local clubs with any help they need Officer recruitment, membership retention, better rallies, etc.

After a cancellation in 2021 due to Covid-19 travel restrictions, we are holding this caravan later this year. Meandering the Maritimes will be a 38-day exploration of the beauty and history of Canada's three Maritime Provinces: Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. We will launch at the north end of Cape Breton Island and wind our way through each of the Provinces. You will experience the history of the colonising groups of French, English, Irish and Scottish settlers and their interactions with the indigenous populations. The history of the region was shaped by European conflicts but much remains today in the form of Gaelic, Acadian and Irish music, languages and traditions. The landscape is simply spectacular, from the highlands of Cape Breton to the awesome tides of the Bay of Fundy and the red sands of PEI, there are vistas everywhere. Lots of seafood too! This will be a relaxed caravan with time off to explore, hike, shop or visit sites with particular interests. It is a prototype caravan with the intention of becoming a recurring part of the Airstream Club National Caravan program.
