On Saturday, after breakfast we wandered around looking at each other's camping gadgets and inside trailers.


As usual at rallies, some *technology transfer* occurs:

Water Safety

Swimming Pools (especially toddlers and young children)

Drowning is still a leading cause of death for toddlers and children. Backyard pools need to protect the neighbors with safety devices, such as fencing, presence of safety equipment (ring buoys, hooks, etc. There should be an adult swimming watch present who not distracted by drinks, phones, friend gatherings and chatting, etc. No older kids.

Here are five survival skills to achieve/document with your youngster or toddler:

- 1. How to jump into water and return to surface.
- 2. Turning around in the water and getting to safety.
- 3. Floating and treading.
- 4. Combining breathing with forward movement.
- 5. Know how to exit the water.

Lifejackets should be worn by weaker swimmers of all ages. Learn CPR!

Open Water (such as lakes, Corps of Engineers lakes)

You can't swim across a cove at a lake and think you will reach the other side, with the swimming pool experience, such as limited size, walls, gutters, etc.

Corps of Engineers project lakes are usually constructed by damming and flooding water ways creating steep banks under water. Swimming areas that are marked off, often have precipitous drop-offs related to how much sand they placed under water. Life jackets are important again as above. Out by the rope is deep with a drastic drop-off usually.

Don't consume alcohol and swim, quite a few inebriated adults have drowned. There are some lifejacket loaning programs at Corps of Engineer lakes—at least this used to be the case.

Open water swimming of a boat can be problematic is wind and current take your boat away. Boat operators should know how to compensate for wind and current.

Boating Safety

In general, be cognizant of environmental conditions, e.g., wind and water temperature. If there's 3-foot waves, you don't want to be out in open water with your john boat. We can have warm days in March and April, but if windy and boat capsizes how long can you last in 40-degree F water—not long, 20 or 30 minutes according to Google. If boating in windy conditions, e.g. 25 mph it's better to stay on shore. https://www.boatsetter.com/boating-resources/how-much-wind-for-boating

Some older people with health problems, have drowned when trying to retrieve their boat when it drifted off its mooring. When on a Corps lake, your own safety is your responsibility.

Get a boat operators license. Don't grandfather in like I did! Have all the safety devices. Some way to communicate, such as VHF 2-way, or cell phones kept in a dry bag.

Kayaks and Canoes

Remember kayaks = life preservers. Also, test your life preserver in a pool to see if it holds your head above water. Life preservers should meet US Coast Guard certifications.

Canoes are more stable, but life preservers should be considered—canoes tip as well.
