Moving on up...by 3 inches By Dale Musser

We've had our Airstream for 10 years now. And since we added on a receiver hitch on the rear of the trailer for our bike rack, the trailer has scraped when pulling in and out of our driveway. Well, I decided it was finally time to do something about that. The solution was a three inch lift kit from Dexter.

Dexter is the manufacturer of our Airstream's axles. They also, manufacture a handy 3" lift kit. We have a dual axle trailer and the kit set me back about \$350. If this is something you might be interested in doing, it is recommended that you contact Dexter to give them the serial number off the axle to get the right kit for your trailer.

Now, with that being said, I didn't know what I was in for when I decided to do the work myself. Luckily, I was able to watch a few videos on YouTube to get some idea of what I was in for. I had to purchase four jacks stands, one floor jack and some nuts and bolts. The jacks are to support the trailer while removing the wheels. I also needed a torque wrench and a welder. Luckily, I already had those in my garage. This is where it gets exciting. There are about eight bolts that you will need to weld stop tabs onto the head. This is because you can't put a wrench on the bolt, due to the location of some of the bolts in relation to other components underneath the trailer. This is an important thing I learned from the YouTube videos. So I wasn't surprised.

This isn't a job for everyone. But if you like working with your hands and have the tools, it is a satisfying job when you complete the task. I was all in for about \$500. If you have a shop do it, it will set you back about \$2000. All in all, for two days worth of work, I think in went well and was worth it. Oh one more thing, you may need to purchase an additional step for your trailer to compensate for the three inches. It's amazing how much those three inches affect the entry to the trailer, especially on a sloping terrain.

What are Rallies all about?

So you bought an Airstream. You bring it home and you are so excited that you join the Las Vegas Airstream Club. Once you join the club, you begin receiving emails with newsletters and rally information. So what *is* a rally? A rally is simply a gathering of Airstreamers camping together.

How do you know about the rallies?

The rallies are listed on our website at <u>airstreamclub.org/las-vegas</u>. They are also, shown in the newsletter, which is emailed out to each member.

How do you sign up for a rally?

In the rally information on the website or in the newsletter, the host will indicate how to sign up. Most of the time, our rallies entail each member contacting the campground or RV park directly to make their own reservation. Once that is done, the member would need to email the host to let them know they made their reservation, so they can be included in any communications about the rally.

What is a Rally Host and what do they do?

The Host is the person who has chosen the rally location. He or she will provide some information for the possible activities in the area. Some hosts may provide a meal or two as a part of the rally. If that happens, there is usually a small rally fee charged to each member. That is determined by the host(s) and is conveyed to the members who have signed up to attend the rally. Closer to the date of the rally, usually I to 2 weeks prior, the host will contact the members signed up to attend and give them the lowdown on the rally. They will indicate if there will be any meals provided (strictly optional for both host and participant) and the rally fee (if any), if there will be a potluck meal and if there will be any group activities.

What happens at a rally?

The Las Vegas Airstream Club rallies are very relaxed. During the day, members can explore the local area. Options may be recreation opportunities, shopping, museums or galleries, depending on the locale. We gather each late afternoon for Happy Hour. During Happy Hour members may chose to bring an appetizer to share with the group and a beverage of choice to enjoy yourself. Some days there is either a hosted or potluck meal, as decided by the host. Sometimes group activities are arranged. But don't fret. It's not all go go go at the rallies. Relaxing and visiting is always on the agenda at a rally.

Rallies are anywhere from 2 to 7 days long. If your schedule doesn't permit you to stay the entire time, make your reservation for the days you can stay and just let the host know which days you will be at the rally. We all understand that some members work and some have other obligations that preclude them from being gone for too many days in a row. Come when you can and stay as long as you can!
