When I was just fourteen years old, we didn't have indoor plumbing. I was a poor kid carrying water from across the street, when up on the highway five beautiful silver trailers went by. I didn't know what they were, but I knew I had to have one.

My wife Ruth and I were high school sweethearts. We married the year after graduation, in 1967, our ages were 18 and 20. Knowing my lifetime dream we purchased our first airstream in 1977. My son was 7 years old. Our first trip was to

Topsail Island, NC. It just happened on that very weekend The Eastern Carolinas Unit of the WBCCI were having a rally. The club president David White invited us to their annual fish fry. They we so warm and welcoming and asked us to join their club. Of course, there was no hesitation on my part. I was delighted to be part of this amazing organization.

In 1978 We purchased a Brand New 1978 International. We traveled with that wonderful group of people for 10 years. We adopted our beautiful daughter Robin when my son was 13 years old. When Robin was only 4 years old, my wife Ruth had been diagnosed with Chronic Progressive Multiple Sclerosis. We had to sell our beautiful airstream. I know I cried for a week. MY dreams and my passion gave way to a whole new journey.

Our God is terrific, and always has a perfect plan. Fast forward 21 years. Just before I retired at age 62, I think it was 2009, we purchased another Airstream. It was a 1998, 34ft. Classic. Twin beds in the back and a very rare front kitchen. Airstream only made 50 of these trailers in 1997, 1998, and 1999. It was perfect for our needs. Of course, we added a wheelchair lift. My wife was totally Quadriplegic, but also extremely courageous and enjoyed life to the fullest. We joined the Carolinas Unit and were delighted to be back in the club. Once again, I was an airstreamer, returning to my roots. WE were so happy. I was asked to be 2nd VP and gladly accepted. Everyone assisted in duties necessary to run our unit and it was such a pleasure to serve.

I lost my beautiful Ruth in May of 2012. So, there went the brains behind the leader. That was devastating after 45 years of a beautiful marriage. So many in our wonderful Airstream group helped me through that trying time. I ended up your 2014 President. It was a pleasure to serve. I highly recommend if you are able, step up and be a leader.

At the present time I am a member without an airstream. My health has suffered a setback, and I am on the mend. I'll be 76 in October. My intentions are to join everyone soon. I miss my beautiful friendships' along with the opportunity to make new memories. Rejoice in the love of this wonderful Airstream family. God bless you all, See you down the road.
