## **Nuts & Bolts**

## **Protecting your RV electrically:**

(EMS - Electrical Management System)

Do you have an EMS or a surge protector for your RV? If not you should purchase one before your next outing. At a minimum you should have a surge protector as an insurance policy against potential damage to your RV electrical components.

A simple portable surge protector is not expensive and is basically a plug and play device. It protects your appliances from sudden electrical surges and high/low voltage spikes.

An EMS offers you full protection from all power related issues including current surges, low/high voltage spikes, open ground, high neutral and incorrectly wired power pedestals. Because of ITS MORE ELABORATE PROTECTION THE EMS comes at a higher price tag than the surge guard.

The choice is yours; both come in portable and hardwired versions. Both devices are designed to protect your RV appliance and components. And both come in 30 and 50 amp versions. Whichever one you decide to purchase, the cost is minimal compared to the cost of replacing a refrigerator, an air conditioner or a converter.

# Where 2 or more Airstreams gather..... Let there be a Rally!!

Let's talk about Rallies: Just what are they, how do they work, why are they important, and who can host one.

First, the back story. Rallies are not unique to the Airstream Club but they just may have originated here. The Airstream Club International (ACI) was founded in 1955 as a Caravan Club by friends of Wally Byam, originator, and founder of the Airstream we all know today. Wally led Caravans of Airstreams all over the globe, many lasting weeks, and even months at a time. Lifelong friendships were formed by the participants. They became a second family to each other.

As the Airstream Club grew, members soon realized there was a need for another method of gathering on a regular basis, but for shorter periods, and at different locations so more people could participate.

The "Rally" concept was born. So now, just what is a rally?

It is indeed a family reunion. Not so different from a Smith or Jones Family Reunion. Typically held on monthly or even an annual basis, they provide the opportunity to gather with this extended family to catch up with friends, to share stories, ideas, and memories, trouble shoot

technical issues, but most of all, to enjoy the fellowship of like-minded people. They range in size from 10-100-1000 rigs. They often offer the opportunity for travel across a state, a region, or the Country.

# **Nutty Apple Muffins**

# **Ingredients:**

34 cup Wesson Oil

1 cup Sugar

1½ cup Flour

2 Eggs

1 tsp. Vanilla

½ tsp. Salt

½ tsp. Baking Soda

1 cup chopped Fresh Apples (red delicious)

½ cup chopped Nuts

1 cup Coconut

# **Directions:**

Combine all ingredients in given order. Mix well with spoon. Spoon into greased muffin tins about half full.

Bake at 350 F. for 20 to 25 minutes.

Makes 16-18 muffins.

Mini Muffins: Bake for 16 minutes.

NOTE: DO NOT double this recipe.







# Chicken al la King

# **Ingredients:**

2 Chicken Breasts (cut into ¾" pieces)

1 tbsp. Olive Oil Pepper to taste

½ Onion



2 (4 oz. cans) Mushrooms (drain juice)

1 can Cream of Chicken Soup

12 oz. Milk

3 cups Frozen Mixed Vegetables

1 tbsp. Parsley

1 tsp. Garlic Powder (optional)

½ tsp. Paprika

1 pkg. Grands Biscuits



## **Directions:**

In a large sauce pan, stir fry chicken in olive oil. Add pepper to taste. Add onion and cook until tender and translucent and chicken is done. Then add remainder of ingredients in given order. Mix well with spoon and let thicken, about 45 minutes to an hour on simmer, stirring occasionally.

Bake biscuits as directed on package. Break biscuits in half, place on plate and spoon Chicken al la King over top. Enjoy.
