So finally after selling our home in Huntington Beach, CA we decide to buy an Airstream and put it in an RV park in Long Beach near the Queen Mary. This location was right between our jobs during the week. We had to decide whether we really had to move to LA.

We purchased a new 2009 International 28 Christopher Deem model with wenge wood. It was gorgeous. We were pulling it with a Jeep Hemi v-8. We joined our first WBCCI unit and we loved it.. and so my rallies began. One year into this adventure I was doing rallies with 80 rigs from all over the West Coast.

After getting our second Golden retriever, we decided to get a 25 easier on our SUV and more floor space for the dogs.

After nine months I sold it and bought a Flying cloud 28, perfect size and the best closet space ever.

On our first night in Napa with our new rig we had a 6.0 earthquake, the back of the trailer was hanging over a ravine, and the wheel chocks moved but not the trailer! Luckily for us, airstreams do well in earthquakes the blinds moved but we were ok.

Then we decided to move east after my husband was flying back and forth three times a month.

So knowing we would need more A/C heading east, I called my favorite dealer and he bought it sight unseen and we got our first Classic with ducted dual A/C units.

We sold our home in two days and drove 3,000 miles in 6 days last year.

This classic is the biggest rig we have ever had and we could feel the extra weight compared to our 28's. It's worth it the galley is big and all of the features are awesome.

We are done, after 13 years we have found our dream trailer. So do not feel guilty if you have to buy and sell a few to get to the perfect one.

The lifelong friends we have made while streaming has been amazing. My in-laws traveled everywhere 350,000 miles in their 22 ft caravelle.

They were our idols.

What Is Silver in the City?

An urban rally, held on the downtown streets of historic York, SC hosted by John Leake and Terry Montgomery. This rally is held to showcase the beauty of small town America as much as it is to honor the legacy of the Airstream community. The town really 'rolls out the red carpet' for this annual event. With over 80 rigs in tow, this one is a sight to see. As an attendee, you'll enjoy special offers from local businesses and restaurants, live entertainment, exclusive shopping and more.

There were concerts every night, discounts for restaurants and shops (over 25 shops directly contributed), a volunteer tour of various Airstreams (there were some real classics there) and even volunteers from local shops serving coffee and pastries. This event is also used to fundraise for P.A.T.H. People Attempting To Help, a local out reach organization, working right in York only. They are true heroes. This year the rally donated a little over \$6000.



Why I Loved It

This is one of the few times I've experienced Airstreamers and locals coming together to enjoy such a spectacular event. Saturday saw many of us opening up our beloved airstreams to the locals so they could see what the excitement was all about. We put an info flyer on our rigs if we were hosting tours with a little info about it. Everyone had the option to stop in and take a look and ask questions. I think I had 50-60 people walk through my rig and answered hundreds of questions. It was so nice to be able to thank those people for letting us invade their town, parking lots and shopping areas for a long weekend!

What Makes It Worth Going To?

As a newbie to Airstreams, camping and Rallies, this was definitely one for the books. Each rally I attend, I meet so many amazing folks, all willing to share their knowledge, experiences and the sheer joy of "Airstreaming." It is truly a family (if you want it to be). Virginia's Peanut Butter Pie

Instructions

Cream together the powdered sugar, peanut butter until crumbly; set aside. Combine the granulated sugar, cornstarch, flour, salt, egg yolks, milk, butter in the top of a double boiler. Cook until thick over medium heat, stirring constantly. (You can also do this in a medium saucepan over low heat... but stand over it so it doesn't burn!)

Prepare the baked pie crust as directed on the package and let cool. Sprinkle two-thirds of the peanut butter/powdered sugar mixture over the baked pie crust and pat down. Pour the cooked custard over this.

Take 3 egg whites
1/4 tsp. of cream of tartar
1/4 cup granulated sugar

Beat the 3 egg whites with the cream of tartar until stiff peaks form, gradually adding the sugar. Spread over the custard. Sprinkle the remaining peanut butter/powdered sugar mixture over the meringue and bake at 350 degrees about 20 minutes until golden brown. Chill the pie for at least 3 hours.

Instructions

PREHEAT OVEN TO 350 DEGREES, I USED OUR
CONVECTION IN OUR AS, KNOWN AS BUBBLES

PLACE FRUIT INTO OVEN SAFE CONTAINERS, I USE 2
RAMEKINS MIX ALL THE OTHER INGREDIENTS AND
POUR OVER FRUIT.

BAKE FOR 30 TO 45 MINUTES OR UNTIL GOLDEN
BROWN.

*ADD SOME VANILLA ICE-CREAM AND ENJOY!

* I SOMETIMES WILL ADD SOME BROWN SUGAR ON
THE TOP TO CRYSTALLIZE.

Ingredients

- 2 cups of fruit
 - 1/2 stick or 2 oz melted butter
 - 1/2 cup of self rising flour
 - 1/2 cup of sugar, or to taste
 - 1/4 cup of milk
