64th Annual Urbanna, VA Oyster Festival NOVEMBER 4-7, 2021





For the last 64 years, the two day festival is on the first weekend in November, the small Town of Urbanna, Virginia has closed down their streets for a weekend full of festivities, food, and fun, all to celebrate our favorite little mollusk, the Oyster! The festival vendors offer about as many ways as you can imagine to enjoy these delicious – locally sourced jewels. If you are not an oyster eater there are many other food treats available. Even though taking part in the food fest, there are many other fun events throughout the two day celebration – live music, a car show, one-of-a-kind Fireman's Parade with sirens blaring (bring your earplugs), Queen's Parade with floats, Shriner midget cars (my favorite) and marching bands.

In previous years, our friends from the Northern Virginia Club (NORVA) have sponsored a rally that allows Airstreamers an opportunity to park as a group close to the festival center (2-minute walk) in a privately owned field. The landowner has agreed to allow us to park there again this year. However, this year the NORVA Club has decided to step back from sponsorship in order to pursue other opportunities. We've had so much fun at past events, it would be a shame to lose the rally so our Tidewater Club has decided to step up and sponsor the rally. The NORVA Club has graciously offered to lend a hand which is most welcome. We will reserve a rally parking spot to the first 30 trailers who respond with a Rally Registration Form and a check for participation. If you sign-up but are unable to attend we will

The most difficult challenge is finding parking. Since we will be parked in a field adjacent to the festival – parking is a non-issue. The cost this year will be \$100 per trailer – that is for parking beginning on Thursday until Sunday (most people pull out on Sunday). It's a dry camping event with generators allowed. The owner of the property allows dumping of gray water if you need to do that. There is not a dump station so you'll have to dump your tanks on the way home. This is usually not a problem.



The Urbanna Oyster Festival is the 2nd Oldest Oyster Festival in the world, and in 1988 was designated as the Official Oyster Festival of the Commonwealth!

We hope you'll join us this year! Mark your calendars!

For What It's Worth Product Review

AEROPRESS

I love a great cup of coffee in the morning especially when we're camping. We have a nice small Mr. Coffee that works fine, however anyone



who has camped with me knows I like gadgets (much to Jayne's amusement). So as a coffee connoisseur I embarked on a more refined way to brew a cup of fine coffee on the road. I discovered the AeroPress Coffee and Espresso Maker with tote bag (\$31.95 Amazon). It's a new type of coffee press that uses a rapid, total immersion brewing process to make smooth, full flavored coffee without bitterness. The kit contains the AeroPress, funnel, scoop, micro-filters, filter holder, stirrer and a small tote bag that holds it all. All you supply is your favorite coffee and hot water. You can make 1-3 cups of delicious coffee in 2 mins. If you want a demonstration, next time we camp together drop by for a cup of morning "Joe" - but not too early!
