

IMPORTANT ITEMS

AMISH DINNERS: Tickets are required for the limited seating. You may go to both a tour and Amish dinner on the same day. If necessary, leave your tour early to be back in the park by 5:15 p.m. Eat a light lunch-Amish meals are huge! Tickets will be sold on a first-come basis beginning on Sunday.

CHAIRS: The chairs are rented specifically for our rally and must not be removed from the Activity Building.

DRIVING: Many Amish buggies and bicycles use the roads in this area, so please drive cautiously. Buggies are slow-moving and may not be marked with a caution triangle or light at night. Horses can be skittish and are often controlled by young people. Please review the Amish country Driving Tips flyer in your welcome packet.

ITEMS OF INTEREST: Check the bulletin board and tables on a daily basis for information about our rally and the community. You may leave items of interest to be posted e.g., items for sale, in the designated folder.

PHOTOS: Please do not ask or take photos of the Amish in or out of our rally site. It is against their religious beliefs. When touring, ask your tour leader if you may take photos of the places you visit.

PROPANE: Tag your tank with your name & WBAC# if turning it in for refill. A tanker comes to the rally grounds on Friday to fill motor homes. Give Fred Kiehl your name, WBAC #, and parking location before 9 a.m.

TRANSPORT TO/FROM THE OHIO SWISS FESTIVAL: Every year, thousands of people flock to this area to attend Sugarcreek's annual Ohio Swiss Festival making parking space a premium. We will provide you free daytime transportation to and from the Swiss Festival on Friday and Saturday. See the program schedule for times. You <u>must</u> wear your name badge and rally ribbon to ride on the bus.

CHECK-IN AT THE CHALET: Friday, 1 to 5 p.m.; Saturday, 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 5 p.m.; Sunday: 3 to 5 p.m. Late arrivals and day-guests will be handled on a case-by-case basis after Sunday. See Fred Kiehl #2544.

GROUND RULES

ELECTRICITY: You are being provided <u>10-amp</u> electric. Please run your refrigerators on bottled gas <u>at all times</u>. Electrical appliances such as AC, microwave, coffee pot, toaster/toaster oven, hair dryer, curling iron, electric blanket, overhead heat strip, or any appliance requiring large wattage cannot be used. TVs and CPAP machines are allowed.

ENTRANCE Please observe the **one-way** direction of traffic at the rally entrance and around the inner traffic circle **at all times**!

FIRST AID: If you need medical attention, you must engage medical help on your own and at your own expense.

GARBAGE: Trash, cans, plastic bottles, etc. must be compacted as much as possible and placed in the <u>dumpsters behind the Activity Building</u>. If dumpster is full, **do not** leave trash bags on the ground.

GUESTS: Guests are always welcome at the rally. All guests whether staying in your RV the duration of the rally or visiting on a day-by-day basis, <u>must register</u>. Guests planning to attend rally programs and/or tours must pay a rally fee and wear a name badge and rally ribbon. Non-paying guests may not attend any rally activities. Turn in badges before departure.

HOLDING TANKS (GRAY WATER): The Ohio Revised Code does not permit draining gray tank water on the ground because of the probability of food particles in it. This also prevents stench and attracting wildlife.

HOLDING TANKS: Holding tanks (both gray and black) will be pumped out on your choice of Tuesday or Friday. Attach your red tag to your dump valve by 7 a.m. on your choice of day. To dump on both days, buy an extra tag at the Chalet (when open) or before evening programs. There are convenient port-a-potty locations on the rally site. There is a portable waste tank if your holding tank gets too full; the sewer hole is in front of the wooden outhouse. Listen for further instructions.

IDENTIFICATION: All rally attendees **MUST** wear their WBCCI name badge and rally ribbon while on the rally grounds and to gain entrance to our rally activities, evening programs, tours, and Swiss Festival transport.

GROUND RULES

PARKING AREAS: RV parking areas are color-coded and carefully planned for best use of the available acreage. Know your color-coded parking location. Your vehicle should be parked at your own RV site when on rally grounds. Guest parking areas are designated near the entrance gate.

PETS: Pets are welcome at the rally if properly cared for and controlled. Please keep your dogs on a leash when outside your RV and always clean up after them. Put poop bags in the dumpster only. <u>Do not</u> walk your pet on the golf course or bring it into the Activity Building, Bandstand, or Swiss Chalet area.

SAFETY: Be aware of your footing as you walk. The park has uneven ground, stones, water hoses, and electric cords. When rainy, expect slippery floors and stair steps and entrance/exit areas muddy. Use a flashlight to walk to your RV after the evening programs.

SMOKING: A city ordinance prohibits smoking anywhere on the park's grounds or in the Activity Building or Bandstand. You may smoke inside your RV unit or outside the rally ground's perimeter.

SECURITY: Protect and secure your RV, property, and vehicle at all times. We cannot always monitor "unwelcome" visitors from checking out our rally site (or your RV). Please help us keep a look-out for suspicious activity in our rally area.

TREES: Please do not trim branches or cut trees.

WATER: Each owner must install a clean, potable water hose to their RV with a free-flowing **Y** to allow the next "down-stream" RV neighbor to attach a hose for their water supply during the rally. Keep your fresh water tank full. Your rally water supply is subject to disruptions and low pressure.
