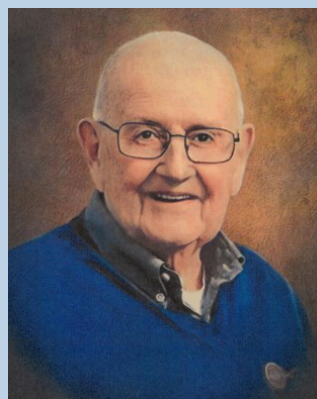

## Charles M. Sanders

Charles Merle Sanders, 90, of Carlisle PA, passed away on Thursday, April 28, 2022.

Charlie was born November 5, 1931, in Abbottstown, PA. He was the son of the late C. Merle Sanders and Nellie I. (Jacobs) Sanders. He married his high school sweetheart, Frances Lee Elgin, August 16, 1953.

He completed his undergraduate degree from Gettysburg College, and obtained a Master's degree in Education from Penn State University. He is remembered fondly by the numerous students and education staff he worked with in the Cumberland Valley and Carlisle School Districts, as well as in the Republic of Palau, Micronesia, through the Department of the Interior.

Charlie valued his years in the military, beginning with college ROTC, serving proudly in the Army during the Korean War, and retiring from the PA National Guard. Retiring at a young age from the Carlisle School District, he and his wife were able to fulfill their hobby of traveling, visiting 28 countries and all 50 states, with most of their highlights involving family and their Airstream trailer.

Charlie was a member (and often an officer) of numerous organizations, including: Carlisle Kiwanis and Elks, American Legion, First United Church of Christ, Carlisle Barracks Retiree Council, U.S.A.H.E.C., Theta Chi Fraternity, 28th Inf. Div. Assoc., Penn State Alum. Assoc., Carlisle Town Band, and Cumberland County Historical Society.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister, Elizabeth (Sanders) Hollinger, and brother, Richard E. Sanders.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his children: Jeffrey (Sherry) Sanders and Shelly (Randy) Teska; 5 grandsons: Jared (Melia) Teska, Simon Teska, Christopher (Alaina) Sanders, Patrick (Alison) Sanders, and Eric (Mariah) Sanders; 4 great-grandchildren: Zoey and Daxton Teska, Roman Sanders and Rory Sanders.

A memorial service was held at 2:00 on Thursday, May 19, 2022, at First United Church of Christ, 30 N. Pitt St, Carlisle, PA.

Entombment service with Full Military Honors was held on Friday, May 20, 2022, at 10:30AM at Indiantown Gap National Cemetery, 60 Indiantown Gap RD, Annville, PA.

## Ways to Save on Fuel When Traveling

Camping season is upon us and we all have the same thought in our minds. Gas prices: they may be on the rise, but will that stop you from using your RV? We don't know what the future holds but with a few changes, you can save on fuel.

**CHECK YOUR TIRE PRESSURE** Always check your tire pressure before you travel and is suggested during your travel as well. If you are traveling in dramatic temperature changes or elevations tire pressure can affect your pressure. The U.S. Department of Energy says that for every 1-psi drop in pressure, you can expect your gas mileage to lower by 0.4 percent. Check the label inside the driver's door to ensure your tires are inflated to the recommended PSI.

**LIGHTEN YOUR LOAD** If you don't have to, try not filling your freshwater tank. One gallon of water weighs about eight pounds. Don't travel with firewood. Buy firewood locally to where you are camping. That can save on weight, fuel economy and reduces the spread of pests from area to area. Go through your RV, if you see items you haven't used in 6 months take it out. Keep items that are necessary and that you use on a regular basis.

**STAY BALANCED** Uneven weight distribution can make your RV sway and that will impact how the vehicle handles. Keep heavy objects closer to the floor, try to balance the weight from front to back and side to side.

**MAINTAIN YOUR VEHICLE** Whether it is your towing vehicle or your RV, maintain it always. The better it is maintained the better it will operate. Change your oil regularly, check your air filter, fuel filter and spark plugs on a regular. If you notice any of them need replaced or have issues, change them immediately. Always use the recommended oil for your vehicle, going cheap will not save you any money.

**DRIVE SMOOTHER** Traveling at a speed of 55-60 miles per hour will help to increase your fuel efficiency. Cruise control helps to maintain a constant and efficient speed. Speeding and rapid acceleration will decrease your fuel economy.

**COOL IT WITH AC** Using your A/C can be a big factor in decreasing fuel economy. If you run the air on max, it can reduce your fuel efficiency by 10 percent. Fresh air is always a plus, especially after those winter months and the weather is getting nicer. However, keep in mind that open windows can affect your fuel mileage.

**CAMP CLOSER STAY LONGER** Camp closer and try to stay an extra day. If you can get away and be closer to home, try and stay an extra day. Many campgrounds offer specials where a longer stay costs less. Those extra dollars can help when it comes to putting fuel in the tank. By visiting [pacamping.com](http://pacamping.com), under "Promotions & Coupons" click on "Special Camping Deals" and to see what Pacamping Campgrounds deals are currently being offered. When you are scoping out a campground to camp at, be sure to explore their websites for camping specials and or ask at the time of making a reservation.

**LOYALTY PROGRAMS** Gas stations and RV parks may offer a loyalty or rewards program. For example, Pilot and Flying J accept Good Sam memberships that apply a discount savings. Gas stations offer this discount as well additional discounts on fuel if you have a credit card with them. Campgrounds sometimes offer a loyalty program and just like other businesses you earn free nights, discounts, and possibly even free items by staying with them.

# Airstream: Products to Consider

Why do we only get the good information around the campfire? Many of us can't be around the same fire and miss out. So, I thought I would share a recent purchase for our Airstream and GMC Denali truck with you.

## HERE ARE THE RULES!

- 1) Any product I share with you doesn't mean you should buy it.
- 2) Whether you like a product or you don't, doesn't mean either of us are right or wrong, I am just sharing our experience with you in case you are considering the same item or want to share your experience.

**Centramatic Wheel Balancers** balance and remove vibrations from your Airstream and tow vehicle, whether your wheels are already balanced or not. Centramatic Wheel Balancers balance your wheels when they are rolling. How? The sealed round tube going around the edge of the disc, is filled with a lubricant and ball bearings that find the area, during rotation, that needs balanced and stays there until the wheel stops rolling. Our experience, like many of you, I can feel a vibration that isn't normal for our vehicles, and I can feel when they go away. There have been several vibrations that are no longer with the tow vehicle and the trailer seems to be pulling smoother. Let me put it this way: in our four years, we have replaced approximately, 25 interior rivets inside our "quality" Airstream, and zero since using Centramatic. A coincidence? Who knows for sure?

Check out the included web address and comments on forums and decide for yourself. My thought was with eight expensive tires, \$219 for four Centramatic Wheel Balancers, only \$50 a wheel I would give them a try. So far...so good. Now if you or your partner are walking beside the trailer while backing into the camp site, the sound or the rolling bearings in the Centramatic is audible. [www.centramatic.com/wheel-balance.rhtml?type=Trailers-RV](http://www.centramatic.com/wheel-balance.rhtml?type=Trailers-RV)

Another great thing about Centramatic, is they have two sizes for ALL Airstream wheel sizes. If you can change a tire, you can install the Centramatics either on your Airstream or tow vehicle. Just remove the wheel, and slide the Centramatic disc on the studs and remount the wheel... all done!

NOTE: The Centramatic Wheel Balancer does not have a "front or back". I tried to place the tube and bearings out toward the wheel, but there was contact with the wheel, so per Centramatic, I simply turned the disc over so the tube and bearings are over the brakes. It's my hope that you find this article and Centramatic's web site entertaining. They may be something to consider and they may not.

# Adirondack Camping

The **Adirondacks** are one of our favorite camping destinations. The area covers over 5000 square miles and offers many of our favorite outdoor activities. It is a full day's drive from south central Pa but has endless hiking, biking and kayaking opportunities.

**Lake Placid** is one of the more popular destinations in the Adirondacks. The Olympics were held here first in 1932 and again in 1980. Visitors can take a chair lift ride to the top of **Whiteface Mountain**, watch Olympic athletes train on the ski jump, or just kick back and enjoy an

Ubu Ale at the Lake Placid Pub and Brewery. We have stayed at the **Lake Placid KOA** and were pleasantly surprised with the accommodations.

We get many questions about our solo canoes at campgrounds and Airstream rallies. They are made in Olmstedville, NY in the heart of the Adirondacks by **Hornbeck Boats**. They were designed by Peter Hornbeck as a lightweight "pac boat" for easy portage between the many tiny ponds dotted across the Adirondacks. They are a small, family run company that has been hand building boats since the early seventies. They have boats on display at the **Adirondack Experience Museum** at **Blue Mountain Lake, NY**. This museum is worth a visit if you are in the area.

Each year **Queensbury, NY** is the host of the **Adirondack Balloon Festival**. This year the 49th edition of the festival will be held September 22-25, 2022. The event is free to the public and will have up to 150,000 visitors over 4 days. We have camped nearby at **Ledgeview RV Park**. The sites are wooded and spacious.

# Central Penn Volunteers at Apple Festival

For many, many years Central Penn has participated in conservation projects at State Parks with Gifford Pinchot being one of them. Years ago, when old time members were younger, they spread many yards of mulch at Pinchot.

Members wondered if other parks could use volunteers and it was suggested Little Buffalo State Park in Newport, PA, so a contact was made with the ranger there. One of the projects was helping to construct an outdoor amphitheater. The ranger mentioned the Apple Festival in Schoaff's Mill and said that they had no volunteers for the event and asked if the club would be interested in this as a conservation project. Club members arrive through the week prior and do some minor cleaning in the mill as well as weighing and bagging corn meal that the rangers grind.



Friday all the chores are completed in advance of the Saturday/Sunday event where we help with the cider press demonstration as well as serving samples of apple cider and corn bread.

We also help with selling the bagged cornmeal and other merchandise Little Buffalo offers.

In exchange for our volunteering, we are offered free camping in the campground. The festival is traditionally the last weekend the campground is open for the season in October so we can camp until Monday at which time the water is turned off!

The club oversaw this project solely for 15+ years working long hours on the days of the festival. I believe 5 years ago we invited our SOB camping friends to help as the days of the festival were long with less Club Members participating. More hands make the work light so instead of working all day, both days we were assigned approximately 2 hour shifts each day. This leaves time to kayak, hike and take advantage of free time in the park and area.

Five years ago the club voted to give up the conservation project and the SOB camping friends stepped up to take over the logistics. Club members continue to participate and are invited to do so.

Over the years the festival has changed. Covid provided some challenges and moved some of the activities outside of Shoaff's Mill. The apple press and corn grinding demonstrations continued indoors moving the sample and merchandise tables outside. Demonstrations (blacksmithing, broom making and cooking apple butter), kids activities, and entertainment have returned.

There is a new ranger who has BIG ideas to expand the event. Last year they had a craft vendor. She has hopes of adding other types of stands and greatly expand the festival making it a much bigger event. If interested, I can provide the connection.

This year the festival is scheduled for October 15 & 16. Camping available starting October 11. An email will go out to anyone who has volunteered in the past (since Tom/Marty took charge of planning) sometime in August. If you have interest and would like to volunteer, please reach out to me ([aesopf96@gmail.com](mailto:aesopf96@gmail.com)) to be added to the email when planning begins.

This is fun event to work with club members and meet new SOB friends and be rewarded by having volunteered in the Newport community. There is also a Potluck dinner in the Welcome Center Saturday night! Food is always good!

# 10 Tips from the Turnpike

It's time to get rolling and here are my top 10 tips for a safe and happy adventure!

**1 Know your towing limits!** I don't mean your tow vehicle's capacity, I mean how long you can sit behind the wheel! Aim for 200 to 300 miles a day. Towing is stressful and will exhaust even the most experienced Airstreamer, so give yourself time to decompress at the end of each long-haul day.

**2 Stop the stops!** It's tempting to stop at every tourist attraction along your route but each unplanned stop burns your daylight. Try not to veer too off course when indulging in local delights, and plan your stops whenever possible.

**3 More than Cracker Barrel!** It's comforting to stop at familiar places for a meal or a break. Chain stores and restaurants are right off the highway! Ask around while getting gas or use an app like TripAdvisor, ForkIt or Yelp to locate local hotspots.

**4 Damn that traffic jam!** Once you have towed through rush hour around NYC, Boston, or Atlanta, you will never do it again, so plan on leaving late and arriving early if possible. If you have to drive during evening rush hour, try stopping for a late lunch/early dinner.

**5 Stash a Stash!** Have I ever told you the story of arriving at Highland Haven with no food and all the groceries and restaurants closed? I've learned to keep a stockpile of packaged, high energy foods and snacks like trail mix, beef jerky, peanut butter, and jelly sandwich fixings, and pouches of tuna/chicken. Make sure you keep these in your tow vehicle in case you are stuck in traffic!

**6 Prepare for the worst!** Keep a proper toolkit and spare tires, invest in a roadside assistance plan, a fire extinguisher and get keep a well-stocked first aid kit. Next, check your health insurance policy for out-of-state coverage specifics, make a list of medications

for all the travelers in your rig and get up to date on immunizations, such as a tetanus shot. Also, ladies consider a STP device. I am telling you, life changed when I discovered the Tinkle Belle.

**7 Beware the weather!** Different areas of the country have different weather even in summer. Be ready for any climate by having winter coats handy year-round as well as sturdy shoes or boots. In the summertime, keep track of triple-digit temperatures, stopping every two to three hours to let your tires cool off. A quick cooldown helps to prevent tires from bursting, so be sure to account for it in your schedule.

**8 Secure a good spot!** Always make a reservation at an RV park or campground when possible because first-come, first-served campgrounds and RV Parks could fill up before you arrive. If you're in a strange town and need a safe place to spend the night, make sure you have reviewed Airstream Member Courtesy Parking, BoonDockersWelcome or become a member of Harvest Hosts for spots. The lure of big box store parking may be overblown in some areas and could mean a fine or unsafe conditions!

**9 Lock tight feels right!** You may be in the middle of nowhere on your journeys but a shiny Airstream will be seen by someone. Make sure you lock your trailer when you are away and invest in a good hitch lock. You get what you pay for and *California Immobilizer* has amazing products!

**10 Keep your stuff tight!** The best strategy for keeping parts and pieces secure and at hand is to designate a space for EVERYTHING in your trailer. Keep everything in its place and put it back in the same spot each and every time. Organization limits searching and keeps you safe. Everyone should know where items like bug spray or medications go.

We have reserved 10 sites at this time. These will be available on a first come basis thru our club. More may be available if needed.

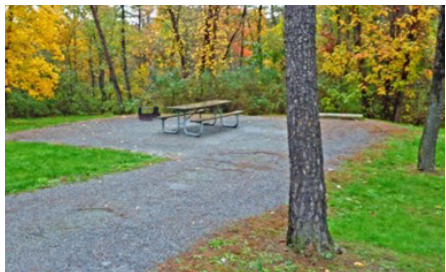

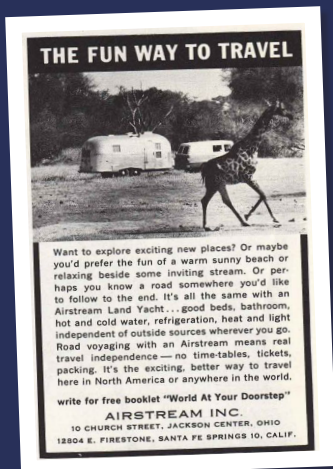

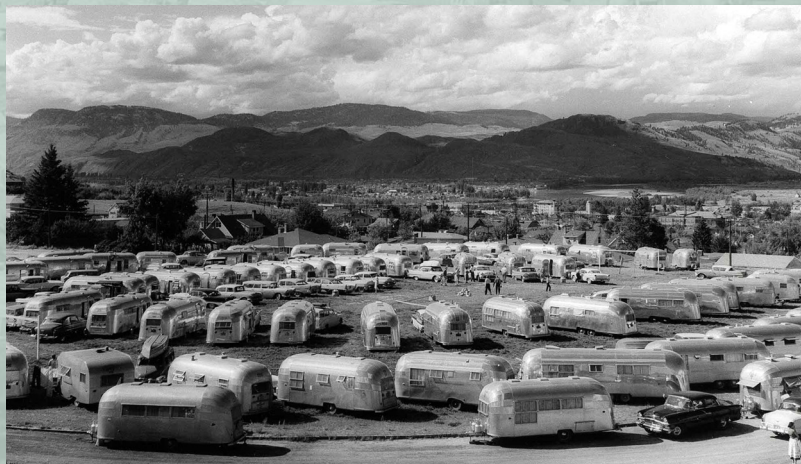
