

#### Fall Food Drive – Please Bring Non-Perishable Food to the Fall Rally!

We will be asking for food donations to support the local St. Clair County Food Bank which is part of the Ozarks Food Harvest Network. For your convenience, collection Bins will be located at the clubhouse. Most needed items:

- Tuna or other canned meat
- Beans, soups or stews

If you had to choose between food and gas for your car, or between food and a roof over your head, what would you choose? Every day, those served by the Ozarks Food Harvest and its network are forced to make these tough choices.

**64%** of households served have low food security (meaning reduced quality, variety, desirability of diet) **\$25K** is the average annual household income (of 89% of households served by the Ozarks Food Harvest and it's network)

## **Birding**

I have watched segments of the first few episodes of Great Courses Signature Collection: Birding in North America, produced by National Geographic (24 episodes). The series is lectures from the South African, James Currie with A/V materials. Currie recommends the National Geographic Field Guide to Birds of North America by Dunn and Alderfer (2017). A few excerpts are as follows: 1. Birds probably evolved from reptiles as exemplified by fossils such as Pterosaurus (65 million years ago) and Archaeopteryx of late Jurassic period (150 million years ago). Remember birding is the study and appreciation of birds' color, distribution, and habitat, such that we can identify them if we know a little bird anatomy and taxonomy. Maybe from zoology courses you learned about kingdom (animalia), phylum (Chordata), class (Aves), order (passerines and non-passerines), family (Cardinalidae), genus (Cardinalis, and species (cardinalis) for the taxonomy of the passerine North American Cardinal. In order to be a birder, you need some equipment.

## **Binoculars**

Equipment needs starting out can be just binoculars (called "bins"), a notebook, and a field guide. With regard to optics, Currie demonstrates with a Nikon, 8 X 42, waterproof, ED, with 8.3 degrees field of view. There are two main types of binoculars, porro and roof. If your price range is at the lower end, a full-size porro would be a safe bet. At the mid-to-high end of the price range, roof binoculars are the way to go. Currie recommends reading reviews on the various options offered by binocular manufacturers. The number 8 in 8 X 42, means the bird is 8 times closer with fixed magnification. The 42 indicates the size in mm of the large objective lens. The larger this number, it is hard to hold it steady—I have some 10 X 50's and this is true. Depth of field is measure at 25 feet +/- 2 ft should be in focus. He recommends waterproof bins pressurized with nitrogen. Glass in bins should be HD-high definition, ED-extra low dispersion, or FL-fluoride glass. There should be anti-reflective coatings, multi. For cleaning, use an oil free brush to remove dust and grit and then use an oil free lens cleaner. Never get insect repellant near any optics.

## **Spotting Scopes**

Spotting scopes are used by some birders who want to reach out further to see birds. Beginning birders probably don't need these. But if you want to see distant waterfowl, sea birds, or raptors, a spotting scope may be desired. The birder can also see more detail. But spotting scopes require tripods which are bulking to carry around. There are straight and angled spotting scopes—to see a high up climbing bird, the angled spotting scope may be better and harder to follow in flight. 15 x 45x and 20 x 65x are a couple of powers available. Beginner tripods may be made of aluminum, whereas more expensive ones are lighter carbon fiber.

## **Photography**

Photography is another avenue to study birds, There may be a Great Course Lecture series on Fundamentals of Photography and there is a Nat Geo Guide to Landscape and Wildlife photography. Phone cameras were not recommended, instead acquire a DLSR (digital lens-single-reflex) camera.
