

Here's a quick overview of the Idaho Airstream Club which began in 1961. Our Unit number is 035. We are part of Region 10, the largest geographical area of WBCCI that includes Idaho, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Montana, British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, and the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

We are members of one of the oldest camping organizations, enjoying RVs that have the longest history. Wally Byam started building Airstreams in the 1930s. In 1951, the Airstream creator invited friends to caravan with him to Central America. These travelers formed the Wally Byam Caravan Club, International (WBCCI) in August 1955. Rallies were soon introduced, and the club grew to cover most of North America – and Europe and Australia.

The Idaho Airstream Club is a 501(c)(7) social and recreational organization. Business meetings, officers, constitutions and bylaws may seem like a burden, but

they've helped this club grow and remain stable. We have guidelines to help us plan rallies and caravans. Our Executive Board and Standing Committees keep our Unit rolling and provide opportunities for our members. The International or "Headquarters" part of the club offers web services, liability insurance for events, tax guidance and protection, and more.

Most people join the Airstream Club to camp more and that is a key part of our club. But the club is more than just a camping club or business structure; it is also each one of you. Members matter. You are the leaders on the Board and Committees. You plan the caravans and rallies, and share ideas for places to camp and explore. You support each other when you come to a breakfast or rally. Members invite other Airstream owners to try the club. You strengthen the club with your ideas and participation. Without you, the Idaho Airstream Club could not exist. And we thank each of you for being a member of the Idaho Airstream Club #035, Region 10.

 - We'll send you your campsite #, and provide the phone number for IDPR. You must call IDPR to complete your reservation and pay for your site.
- ► Be sure to indicate if you're interested in the special Observatory Tour.
 - O Your cost will be determined by the total number of people who sign up.

A *final rally fee* will be calculated and collected before the rally ends. This per person fee covers expenses not known at the time of the Initial Rally Deposit. It will include such things as your observatory costs, host-provided meals, etc.

If you cancel, your initial rally deposit may not be fully refunded.

Idaho State Park camp sites have water and 30 amp electricity, but no sewer hookups. A dump station is available.
