**Membership Chair:** Eight new members; we now have 163 member rigs and 28 affiliate member rigs (303 members and 47 affiliate members)

#### Old Business:

- 1. Maxi Millican has agreed to chair a committee to review and update our bylaws. They aren't with us today because they are finishing up the Newfoundland caravan they joined this summer. Updates we have discussed in previous meetings are to mirror International and Regional structures such as:
  - a. President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Past President, dropping Second and Third Vice President positions—rationale is that it is too hard for members to commit to serving four years in a row.
  - b. Extending terms to two years—this is how Region 9 operates and it allows the President more time to continue momentum. It does mean that the office of President will be four years (two as President and two as Past President) but the other offices will just involve a two-year commitment.
  - c. Make other minor changes to mirror international's deletion of the delegate process
- 2. As you know, the proposal to restructure ACI's organization passed by a significant margin. To those of you who voted, thank you. Some members had strong feelings about the proposal and, if this didn't go the way you wished, please be assured it doesn't change much for us on the local level.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Jennifer Dice, our First Vice-President, will move to President at the Installation Rally in Glen Rose in November. Anyone wanting to assume any of the positions in the club (Secretary, Webmaster, Treasurer, Social Media) please approach Jen as these are not elected positions.
- 2. Maribeth Pappas has chaired a committee planning next year's campouts. On the list for next year are some of the tried-and-true favorites but several exciting new places will be "unveiled" at the Installation Rally.

**Upcoming Rallies:** Our next campout will be October 7-9<sup>th</sup> at Hordes Creek Lake COE Park in Coleman, Texas. This is a beautiful park, and a quiet time of year to camp. We don't yet have a host for this rally. The Installation Rally, November 18-20, will be hosted by David and Anna Brandon (outgoing President and Secretary) at Oakdale RV Park in Glen Rose, TX. ### **RECIPE OF THE MONTH**



If you like Instant Pot cooking (recipe is for the mini Duo) in your trailer-it is squash season...and almost time for soup!

**Cream of Butternut Squash and Ginger Soup** 

2 butternut squash peeled and seeded, then cube

1 sprig of fresh sage

1 onion-chopped

½ in piece of fresh ginger, peeled (ground ginger can sub)

1/4 tsp nutmeg

4 cups vegetable stock

Olive oil

4 Tbl heavy cream

Salt and pepper to taste and roasted pumpkin seeds for garnish.

- 1. Pressure cooker on sauté with 1 Tbl of olive oil- heat the onions with the sage, salt and pepper until onions are soft. Scoot the onions aside and cover the base with some squash cubes, let brown, stir occasionally (about 10 min). Turn off Sauté function.
- 2. Add the rest of the squash along with ginger, nutmeg, and stock.
- 3. Close and lock the lid, set for 15 minutes on high pressure cook.
- 4. When time is up, release the pressure on quick release.
- 5. Fish out the woody sage stem and discard.
- 6. Now blend the soup and cream, with a stick immersion blender, or potato masher/whisk by hand.
- \*Garnish with salty toasted pumpkin seeds, or parsley.
