But, we also need you to vote on the proposed changes to the WBCCI Constitution. In order for our club (NYFLAC) to be represented at least 20% of our membership are required to vote. That is A MINIMUM of 23 club members who must vote. As of this moment 11 members, or 10%, have voted. If we do not reach 20% NYFLAC voices will not be heard. Every, single WBCCI member has one vote!! Let your voice be heard!!



"The Future Of The Past... A Celebration Of The Mothership & The New Airstream Heritage Center 91 Years Of Travel Adventure" And we were there!!!

Quite a while ago, we were all given the chance to attend the 90th Year Celebration at the Heritage Center in Jackson Center. As "newbies" we knew little about the infamous Jackson Center, but were very interested in anything having to do with Airstreams. The format was a lottery from which sixty-five names would be pulled. Even though we knew the odds were low, we submitted our name and were absolutely thrilled when we received our invitation!



The event, scheduled for 2021, was postponed - of course. Finally, it was held this past Memorial Day Weekend. A healthy rainstorm greeted us as we pulled into the employee parking lot. There were 40+ rigs parked with us, and at least 15 personally owned vintage trailers parked in the visitors' lot.

We experienced all sorts of treasures over the next couple of days. One of the most incredible was a tour of the manufacturing facility. To see all of those silver trailers take shape from the inside out; with the parts and furniture and fabrics and gadgets in their own particular spot - organized and catalogued precisely. As you can imagine,



the room was HUGE; with many break rooms, vending machines full of safety equipment, a viewing mezzanine, and much more. It was absolutely riveting - I know - that was on purpose! Anyway, the included picture does not even begin to show how immense and impressive it is.

The Heritage Center officially opened to the public on June 1, 2022. So everything we were experiencing was a "first". The tour of the Heritage Center Museum was fascinating. There were many pictures, artifacts, and stories about Wally Byam's life; his vision, creed, and accomplishments.





Many more vintage trailers (years of construction ranged from 1938 - 1984) are on permanent display in the museum, many in their original state and others which have been restored (for example: Wally's famous white Airstream from the European Caravan). In addition, there are historically significant displays such as the NASA Apollo 11 Quarantine collaboration. A few exhibits are just plain quirky, like the 1984 Funeral Coach - yes, very strange! Adding to the charm are a cozy fire pit surrounded by camp chairs, collections on loan from caravan travelers, and several amazing pieces by Airstream artists Michael DePraida and Frank DeBona. The wonder that is Airstream is evident in every corner of that beautiful space!

Jackson Center itself is very quaint. It is a small community that obviously has a lot of pride in their town and its role with such a prestigious company. It was fun to spot trailers in various stages of completion here and there around town. We attended a viewing of <u>Alumination</u> at the local theater - another treasure. This is a recently completed documentary by Eric Bricker and Lisa Hughes. It was fascinating and really well-done. It can be viewed now on a few streaming services, and will probably be available on DVD in the fall.

The event really was a celebration; live music each night, food trucks, a Vintage Trailer Open House each evening, and presentations on various topics during the day. There was also daily access to the Heritage Center with its café, gift shop, and comfortable places to sit and chat.

The whole weekend was a wonderful display of beauty, history, commitment, and love of the Airstream way of life. What a privilege it was to participate in this "once in a lifetime" celebration!

Region 2—Caravan Opportunity

Meandering the Maritimes: A Region 2 Caravan August 18, 2022 to September 25, 2022

After a cancellation in 2021 due to Covid-19 travel restrictions, we are holding this caravan later this year. Meandering the Maritimes will be a 38 day exploration of the beauty and history of Canada's three Maritime Provinces: Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. We will launch at the north end of Cape Breton Island and wind our way through each of the Provinces. You will experience the history of the colonising groups of French, English, Irish and Scottish settlers and their interactions with the indigenous populations. The history of the region was shaped by European conflicts but much remains today in the form of Gaelic, Acadian and Irish music, languages and traditions. The landscape is simply spectacular, from the highlands of Cape Breton to the awesome tides of the Bay of Fundy and the red sands of PEI, there are vistas everywhere. Lots of seafood too!

This will be a relaxed caravan with time off to explore, hike, shop or visit sites with particular interests. It is a prototype caravan with the intention of becoming a recurring part of the Airstream Club National Caravan program. We have a few vacancies at this time, so don't hesitate to contact us for more information. The kitty fee is \$4500 Cdn for an Airstream with 2 people, \$3400 for a solo traveler.
