Meet Elise and Nathan Winchester

We own an architecture firm, Winchester Architects, that is located in Bryan and we live in College Station with 3 dogs and 6 chickens. I retired from TAMU in 2019 and I'm now the office manager for our firm. Nathan is the principal architect. Travel is one of our passions and we enjoy spending weeks each summer in New Mexico and Colorado. We take our portuguese water dog, Henna, with us and usually stay in AirBnBs. One of our motivations for buying an Airstream is to be able to take our other dogs with us (a yorkie and a rat terrier mix) when we travel. Asking a host to accept 3 dogs in an Airbnb is asking a lot - I wouldn't rent to us! We both enjoy live music, hiking, road trips, art, and architecture. Nathan is into dirt and street bike riding and



fast cars. I love going to music festivals with hanging out with my girlfriends who mostly live in the hill country.

We were given the option of choosing between the Houston or the Hill Country units and we opted for the Hill Country unit (of course). We met at Liberty Lunch in 1996 when we both lived in Austin and our first date was to SXSW. We own 27 acres with an incredible view between Wimberly and Blanco and are working on plans for our winter "retirement house". I put quotes around retirement house because Nathan feels the same way as Willie Nelson, why would I retire from something I love? I don't feel that way.

This is our first Airstream, prior to it we had a pop-up camper that was given to us by a client. It was in near perfect condition, and we enjoyed camping in it. However, as we matured, we began to long for something with a bathroom and solid walls. The airstream was purchased by close friends about 5 years ago and brought to Bryan from Oklahoma. They made some much-needed updates (plumbing, wiring, A/C) and were using it mostly as an office. I fell in love with it the minute I saw it and made them promise to give me first option if they ever sold it. Finally, in May, they were ready to sell, and I was able to purchase it from them. Win-Win! She's a 1965 Overlander 26', and I named her Plan B. I was born in 64 and Nathan in 66 - so Plan B is the same age as us. We have all of her original paperwork and manual. She was originally purchased in CA.

There is a company in B/CS called Trailer Trashin that restores airstreams, and when they saw her they got very excited because she has almost all of her original - everything (even the sink covers). She is very well preserved inside and out, there is very little rot, and the basics have already been updated. My vision is to keep her as original as possible and build on her mid-century modern style. There are a few things we plan to change to make her more adapted to our life-style. We want to remodel the bathroom and make some minor renovations to the kitchen. The original interior and exterior skins are in great shape, so we'll be keeping those. We will probably add a tankless water heater and maybe solar panels. It looks like we may be able to keep the original canopy with some minor repairs.

Her maiden voyage will probably be to Palo Duro Canyon since we've never been there and have been wanting to go for a long time, and we have friends with property in Terlingua that we'd like to visit. And, there's always summers in the mountains of New Mexico and Colorado!

Just an aside, Nathan has a completely restored 1966 Ford 150 that will like really sweet towing her.




