

"Outdoor Cooking"

Why have an outdoor kitchen when the Airstream has a perfectly outfitted kitchen? There are many reasons but most say that it cuts down on cooking smells and grease build up in the RV, reduces the heat inside the RV, provides more room especially if two are cooking, grilling is one

of the most tasteful ways to enjoy various meats and also you can't replace the view when you're cooking outside versus inside the Airstream. And food just plan tastes better outside.





What is necessary for cooking outdoors

- Small sturdy table
- Lightweight, covered grill either propane or charcoal
- Propane Stove with good wind screens
- Appropriate utensils: Tongs, Spatula, leather gloves, Paper towels

If you really want to have fun, consider adding a Dutch Oven in your repertoire.

You can bake, roast or fry using a Dutch Oven... all with charcoal. See the October Blue Beret for ideas on how to bake with a Dutch Oven.

The WBCCI RV Service Net announces a new Echolink net. Its target audience is Technician Class hams, or those who are unable to have HF stations for whatever reason. The net has been successful so far, but could always use more check ins!

Wednesday evenings at 7pm Central Time 8pm ET). We have arranged with the <u>Family Motor Coach</u> <u>Association Amateur Radio Club</u> to use their Echolink node. It is actually an Allstar node too, but that is transparent for our purpose. The node will support up to 50 connections. This will be a trial to see if it solves our bandwidth problem.

The node name is: FMCA-ARC The node number is: 522547 Day and Time: Wednesdays at 19:00 Central Time, 20:00 Eastern (ie, 8pm)

We want to thank Stan Patterson, KK4PF for the use of his Echolink node for a few weeks. It helped get the RVSN Echolink net off the ground.

A detailed discussion of Echolink would take this entire newsletter. If not familiar, please look at the myriad of help available on the web and YouTube. Echolink can be enjoyed by those with no radio equipment at all). There are apps for Apple and Android, tablets as well as phones even Linux boxes. A place to get started is <u>https://echolink.org/</u>.

You will have to upload an official copy of your FCC license to <u>EchoLink.org</u> to be able to sign in to EchoLink. It's a fairly quick process. Normal FCC requirements for station ID apply when using Echolink. <u>How To Obtain Official Authorizations from ULS</u>. You'll need your FRN from your license to register.

Please consider joining us, even if you participate in the morning HF nets.


New Bern MORE (Rogue) Rally September 29-October 2nd
