



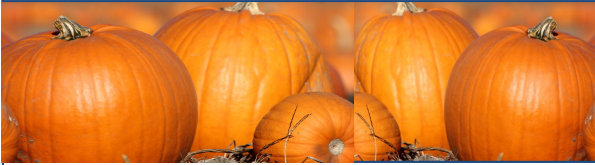

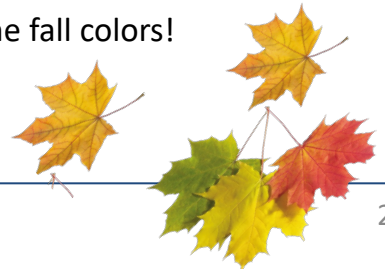

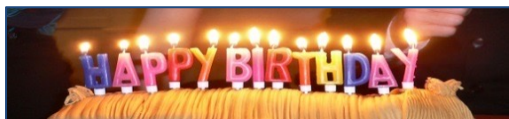

What you need to know about your RV power cord

All RVs have an RV power cord. It is the lifeline for all things electrical when plugged into an electrical pedestal at your favorite campground. Typically they come in lengths of 25 or 50 feet. With our Airstreams we are concerned about two power cords in particular, either the 30-amp or the 50-amp cord.

The 30-amp cord has a plug with 3 prongs: One is a 120 volt hot wire, one is a neutral and one is a ground wire. Usually mid-size RV'S have a 30-amp power cord because of the lower load requirements. A 30-amp feed brings 3,600 watts (30 amps x 120 volts) into your RV.

The 50-amp power cord plug has 4 prongs: two 120 volt hot wires, a neutral and a ground wire. Even though it is called a 50-amp connection, it actually supplies two separate 50-amps, (120 volt feeds). A 50-amp feed brings in 6,000 watts from each hot wire for a total of 12,000 watts. Most RV'S are wired to use each side of the 120 volt service separately, sending 120 volts to two separate legs of service.

Just as a word of caution, do not plug your RV into a 30-amp clothes dryer outlet or any other outlet that is not rated for RV'S. Clothes dryer outlets are wired differently and supply 240 volts.

Do not do it. Ever!!

There are times when the power service pedestal does not match your RV. Not to worry, there are adapters to handle this situation. They are called dog bone adapters because of their shape. If your RV is 50-amp and only 30-amp is available, you will need a 50-amp female to a 30-amp male adapter. There are other adapters available but I will not mention them so as not to cause a lot of confusion.

In closing I will mention that you can also adapt up. It is rare but you could be in a situation where you have your 30-amp RV at a campsite that only has 50-amp service available. As I mentioned earlier, there is no cause for concern because there is an adapter for this situation also.

I know what you might be thinking by now. How many of these blasted adapters do I need to carry? Do I need a separate tote just for power cord adapters? The answer is no. If you have a 30-amp RV you should at a minimum carry a step down adapter to go from 30-amp to 15-amp. If you have a 50-amp RV, you will want to carry a 50-amp down to a 30-amp and a 30-amp down to a 15-amp adapter.

As always, I hope you find this information is helpful. If you have any suggestions for future nuts and bolts please let me know. I will be glad to research it and include it in an upcoming issue of the newsletter.

Our PSAC Pet Stories

I have had a bird since I was little. Even in college I had a little parakeet who used to keep me company and talk to me while I drew on my drawing board.

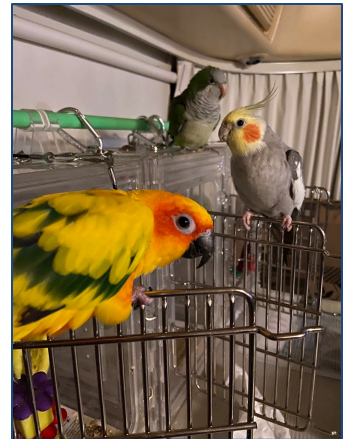

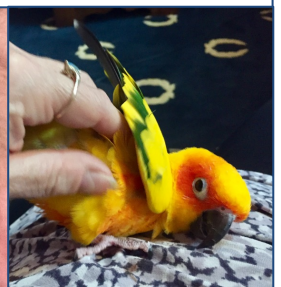
He does not like being separated from our other bird, Bandit or should I say Bandette.

Our next oldest bird or middle bird is Bandit "*Bandette*", who was born in October of 2013. She is a Sun Conure. Bill and I got her after his Quaker died. She was 4 months old. She will be 9 this October. They can live 15-25 years, but some have been known to live up to 30 if well taken care of. He (she) was named after the little dog from the Johnny Quest show that we both watched as kids growing up, but she has orange patches around her eyes instead black patches.



We both thought she was a male up until this past May. We came home from a rally at Mount Airy and when taking her home cage out to clean it, we found 2 eggs laying at the bottom of her cage. Typically, a Sun Conures mature about age 2. I guess we had a late bloomer or he (she) transgendered on us. Yikes!!! Anyways, we had to change her name from Bandit to Bandette.

She says very few words and Sun Conures aren't known for their ability to talk. She says her name "Bandit," "kiss", "stop it," and mimics words with her beak but doesn't say them. She can be extremely loud at times, mostly when other people are around.

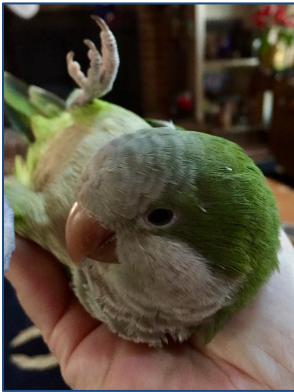


Our PSAC Pet Stories

She loves to chew wood, so Bill will cut blocks of untreated wood and we hang them in her cage. She will chew them up in a matter of minutes.

She and our Cockatiel friend Ozzie, are best buds. If separated they scream until you put them back next to each other. They sit side by side at home in their cages so they have been buddies since day one when we brought Bandette home. So when bringing them from the truck into the Airstream they will scream until we put them next to each other again.



Our youngest feathered friend is Rocket. We got him when we were in Florida, near Cape Canaveral on vacation. A rocket went off on the day we got him, so we decided to call him Rocket, and boy does he fit that name! He is a Quaker Parrot or a Monk Parakeet. He was born in July of 2016, so he just turned 6 years old. We got him when he was about 8 weeks old. They can live 15-30 years if eating a well balanced diet.

He is a talker, and a feisty little guy with a great personality! He can say over 20 word phrases, such as "take a bath; what you want; what you doing; want to come out, hey, little buddy, good morning, give

me a kiss; peek-a-boo; whoo-hoo" and so many more word phrases. Quakers are extremely intelligent and very playful. He loves his toys, especially a plastic ring and his bells. He is most loyal to Bill but will also tolerate me and he gives us both kisses and allows us to pet him and play with him, when he's in the mood. Bill has even taught him to give him "five". Of course with doing that he expects a treat. Bill calls him his Italian bird because he likes to eat spaghetti. Quakers do not like anyone to mess with their cage. They are extremely protective of their area.

We call them our "bird gular" alarm because when people come up our driveway, they let us know. All 3 birds are about 12" from head to tail and mimic my laugh.

We love these little feathered friends, they don't need walks, or have to be fed twice a day. They make messes by their cages but not all over the house or our trailer. We let them out to play because they enjoy playing with us, as much as we like to play with them, except for Ozzie; as mentioned above, he does not like to be touched.

I hope my little story about these little feathered friends makes you think that they can be special friends, too. They don't ask for much except for clean water and food at least every other day. Recipe

2 Ingredient Pumpkin Spice Cake

A can of pumpkin and a cake mix is all you will need for this moist cake!

Minutes Prep Time: 5

Minutes Total Time: 40

Servings: 10

Difficulty: Easy

Ingredients:

Pam Baking Spray or wax paper

1 pkg. (15.25 oz. each) Duncan

Hines Signature Spice Cake Mix

1 can (15 oz. each) solid-pack pumpkin

½ cup water

Powdered sugar (optional)



Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Spray 9x13" baking pan with baking spray or line with wax paper.

In a medium bowl, thoroughly combine cake mix, canned pumpkin and water, and stir until smooth. Pour into prepared pan and spread evenly to the edges.

Bake cake in center of oven 24 to 28 minutes, until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Let cool completely. Sprinkle with powdered sugar, if desired, before slicing and serving.

Tip: Try with yellow cake mix or chocolate cake mix.

Ham Sliders

Ingredients:

1 dozen dinner rolls, (any variety)
cut all in half before placing in pan.

12 slices Swiss cheese

1 pound sliced honey ham

Glaze:

1 stick butter

1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

2 T. brown sugar

1 T. dry mustard

1 T. poppyseed



* Layer ham & cheese onto the bottom half of cut rolls and cover with tops. Place in a 9x13 pan *

Instructions:

Melt butter and Worcestershire sauce together. Add brown sugar and continue to melt. Add mustard and poppyseed. Bring this mixture to a boil and let it boil together for about 1 minute. Spoon mixture over the top of the sandwiches, cover with foil and refrigerate for up to 4 hours before baking.

(I find that using toothpicks keeps the foil from sticking to the top of the sandwiches).

Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for 15-20 minutes.
